What is a zero period!

- Students will receive school transportation as needed.
- The zero period will not interfere with the rest of the student's schedule.
- Students will walk to WMS for their 1st period class.


Who can take Level 1?

- Become a more globally competent citizen by learning about different cultures.






French Bue


