

10th Grade Registration

Registration for your 10th grade classes will take place from February 9th-15th. You will be given a registration appointment time in the weeks before we begin registration that will indicate what day and time your appointment is, and which counselor you will be meeting with. When it is your time to register, go to the media center to meet with a high school counselor. Registration appointments will be virtual for parents and in-person for students. The Google Meet link are listed below and will be emailed again the week of registration. When it is your appointment time, parents can click on the hyperlink and join the meeting. We ask that parents do not log in earlier than your scheduled time. Once you've logged into google meet, it'll place you in the waiting room. We know you are there. Some meetings may run longer than 15 minutes. We ask for your patience. If you and your student use a service such as Facetime, Google duo, or IMO, feel free to use this platform instead of Google meet. We will have your student call you when they are ready to register

Students: Please look over the registration form. Your core classes will be auto-populated. If you plan on taking an AP course, please let your counselor know. Your attention should be on selecting your electives and alternates. Please write down any questions before you come so that we can maximize our time. 
Identifying Signs of Vaping and Nicotine Addiction

Classroom Connections



Algebra/Geometry Block - Students have now started Geometry content and have already studied polynomials in a Geometric context and introductory Geometry vocabulary. They are learning how to use a compass and straightedge to perform basic geometric constructions and will move into geometric proofs and congruent figures this month.

Algebra 1 - Algebra 1 is starting an in depth study of quadratics. Students have been factoring polynomials and will continue to build on this throughout the 2nd semester. If your child is absent, please make sure they are keeping up with assignments on Google Classroom, staying after school for tutoring on Tuesdays/Thursdays, or coming to Ninth Grade Campus Saturday School to catch up. Geometry - Honors Geometry students have just finished a unit on investigating similarity and will begin learning about right triangle trigonometry and circles this month. Students typically enjoy this unit because they get to see how applicable the trigonometric ratios can be in life.

Health and PE

Health classes will be focusing on mental health with an emphasis on suicide prevention. Suicide is the second leading cause of death for ages 10-34. Students will be made aware of the warning signs and how they can help others. Students will also learn how important self care is and will become familiar with the strategies and techniques they can use to promote good mental fitness.



Civics - For the month of February, civics students will be studying the powers, limitations, and qualifications of the three branches of government.

AP Human Geography - Students will begin Unit 6 where they will be studying the origin, distribution, and systems of cities as well as, the urban structure, challenges and sustainability of cities.

World Geography - Students have started to explore Asia. They will learn about the human and physical geography of this region of the world.


Classroom Connections

CTAE Spotlight

Construction students in Mr. Walker's classes are learning to inspect, safely use, and maintain power tools. Students are also learning how to use the circular saw, jig saw, and sawzall through hands-on experiences. They are also learning about the PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) that is required to work in the shop or on a job site.



Biology students will continue learning about genetics and heredity into the month of February. Students will then study ecology, organisms, and evolution to finish out before the EOC in May. Students are working on daily review questions to recap the content covered during the first semester as we prepare for the End of Course Test on May 9th. They will also be doing some reading and progress learning review throughout the semester to keep all of the content fresh in their minds. Ck12.org provides a wealth of information for students to use for review on their own as well as the biology study guide provided by the GaDOE.



Literature classes are working through Unit 3 of our new Pre-AP curriculum and will read excerpts of the classic American novel, To Kill a Mockingbird, which is a focus of Pre-AP Unit 4. To Kill a Mockingbird's famous and beloved father-figure, Atticus Finch, skillfully uses rhetoric as he defends his unpopular- and unlikely- client, Tom Robinson, requiring students to recall and draw on their knowledge of rhetorical appeals from first semester. Honors literature students have recently finished TKAM and will soon tackle the Shakespearean tragedy Romeo and Juliet as part of the media focus of PreAP Unit 4. They will discuss the difference between reading a text and viewing a performance based on that text. Finally, honors students will spend much of this semester composing essays and practicing MLA format in response to these focal texts. We are off to a busy but beneficial beginning to second semester! Look out parents; time will fly from here!

Self-Contained SPED Classrooms

This month students will focus on famous men, women, and events for Black History Month through the News 2 You curriculum. In addition, various activities and CBI trips will be focused on Black History Month.
