Scheduling Information for 2024-2025

Scheduling for the 2024-2025 school year has started. All students in grades 9 - 11 will have individual appointments with their guidance counselors to select their core courses, electives, and World Language for next year. Students should use the calendar invitation as their pass to leave class during their scheduled appointment time.

Digital SAT Information for 2024

Middletown North Earns Advanced Placement Female Diversity Award

Middletown North has been awarded the College Boards Advanced Placement Science Computer Female Diversity Award. This award acknowledges 1,127 schools for expanding young women's access to computer science coursework. In order to be eligible for the award, the school had to demonstrate more than 50% enrollment of females representation in one of two AP Computer Science classes.

What's New at Our Middle Schools

Middle School Elective Redesign

To better support our students at the middle school level, we have been examining the current activity arts (elective) cycle. The current activity arts teachers have been a part of providing feedback regarding the course content, length of courses, and sequencing. It is always sound practice to evaluate these factors every 3-5 years. The middle school group has also been reflecting upon the Advisory period and how to better utilize this time within the schedule. In examining this feedback, there will be some structural and content changes to the middle school activity arts (electives) for the 2024-25 school year. This will provide our students a greater degree of flexibility and choice in their non-core courses. More information will be forthcoming to parents as the middle schools begin to schedule for next year. The middle school course guide will also be updated as a point of reference for parents.

Girls in Motion

Harmony to Hold "Super Bowl" of Reading



Harmony is excited to begin its annual "Super Bowl of Reading" event. This is a voluntary activity designed to encourage reading at home for all students at Harmony in grades pre-k through five. The class that reads the most at each grade level will be recognized, as well as the student who reads the most in the entire school! This year, students will still complete ONE football pattern for every 7 books or chapters that they read. Students should bring their completed footballs to the school where we will display these touchdowns outside their classroom doors. Assigned reading, buddy reading, and listening to a story are all reading experiences that count towards touchdowns! The Super Bowl of Reading begins Friday, February 2nd and ends on Sunday, February 11th at 5:00pm (Super Bowl Sunday).

Orton Gillingham Trainings

The district has been working toward getting all of our K-2 teachers trained in Örton-Gillinghman. Orton-Gillingham is a multi-sensory approach to instructing foundational literacy skills that relies heavily on the Science of Reading. This highly structured approach to teaching reading, breaks reading and spelling into smaller skills over time. The approach is explicit, direct, sequential, and systematic. While this approach is ideal for all students, it is particularly important in remediating reading difficulties, such as dyslexia.
