

We offer a research-based intervention program that provides explicit, systematic, sequential, and multi-sensory methods to help develop automaticity in students.

Interventions focus on:

- Phonemic Awareness
- Sound Symbol Association
- Syllabication
- Orthography
- Morphology
- Syntax
- Reading Comprehension
- Reading Fluency



What is dyslexia?

- A specific learning disability
- Neurological in origin
- Involves difficulties with decoding, spelling, and word recognition.
- Caused by deficits in phonological processing (distinguishing parts of words and sentences)
- Other consequences: comprehension suffers, reduced reading experiences and vocabulary growth is delayed

How Can I Support My child?

- Ask your child's school about access to Learning Ally and encourage your child to read/listen to audiobooks every day.
- Praise your student for their success!

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any student in Kindergarten through 12th grade who has been identified as having dyslexia or a related disorder is eligible for dyslexia services and interventions.

WHEN ARE SERVICES PROVIDED?

Students receive 2 to 3 hours of dyslexia intervention, weekly provided by a certified trained teacher.

- Elementary: small group pullout
- Secondary: Dyslexia Reading class
