Arab is a category that identifies people who speak the Arabic language as their mother tongue.




Generally, Islam considers Christians and Jews as People of the Book (Ahl



Three dominant themes can be found across the

Arab World

1 -FAITH plays a very important role in the lives of most Arabs, regardless of their religion.

FAMILY is an extremely vital element to the lives of Arabs, not only as a source of support, but also of identity.

COMMUNITY An extension of faith and family is community. It is a connection to culture for enjoyable and organizational purposes.

Five Pillars of Islam

The First pillar is **Shahada**: Shahada – Pillar One This pillar is the main belief of all Muslim people and it is a declaration of their faith. The English words are: "There is no god except Allah, Muhammad is the messenger of Allah." Muslims say this when they pray.

Second pillar is **Salah**: This pillar is prayer. Muslims pray five times a day and follow a special ritual to do so. First they must wash in symbolically clean water. All the prayers are said at the same time every day. Fajr – Morning, between dawn and sunrise. Zuhr – Mid-day or early afternoon. Asr – Late afternoon. Maghrib – Evening, around sunset. Isah – Night, before going to bed.

The second Pillar is **Zakat:** the Zakât-Charity.Zakat is a powerful tool to help re-circulate wealth to those most vulnerable,

Five Pillars of Islam Cont.

Fourth Pillar is **Ramadan**: Ramadan is when Muhammad began receiving messages from God. For 30 days Muslims fast, they do not eat or drink during daylight hours.

Fifth pillar is **Hajj**: every adult Muslim who are physically and financially able must make at least once in their lifetime.

(In Islam, the Kaaba is believed to be a sacred site built by prophets Ibrahim an and that its use as the qibla was ordained by Allah in several)


EID

- 1- The fast-breaking evening meal after sunset is known as the "iftar" Eid al-Fitr begins at the end of Ramadan (when the new moon is sighted), with 2 or 3 days of joy & thanksgiving.
- 2- Eid ul-Adha ('Festival of Sacrifice') is one of the most important festivals in the Muslim calendar. The festival remembers the prophet Ibrahim's willingness to sacrifice his son when God ordered him to.

What is a Hijab?

Hijab is part of the religion and constitutes the dress code ordained by Islam on Muslim women.women when in public among unrelated men

- Clothing must cover the entire body except for the face and hands when in the company of non-related males.
- Clothing must be loose, so the shape of the body is not seen.
- Thick enough so that it is not see-through.
- Should not be showy


