Course Description

To help students understand and appreciate the earth's physical features. We will particularly focus on the relationship between physical geography and human geography. In other words, how has the earth's geography influenced humans and how have humans affected our environment. Students will also focus on the relationship between governments with a special emphasis on how they cooperate to help less developed countries. We will also examine migration patterns around the world to help us understand the positive and negative aspects of cultural diffusion.

Essential Questions

How are the tools of geography used to represent time, space and place?

How do physical features, natural resources and locations (geography) influence freedom and liberty?

How do human actions to control freedom and liberty reflect in geography around the world?

How does the pursuit of liberty and freedom alter people, physical features, resources or places of the earth?

What critical decision has had the most significant impact on the geography of the region?

What are the circumstances surrounding human rights in the region?

How have specific beliefs, ideas, and diversity impacted the geography of the region?

How has the geography of the region changed over time?

How has geography shaped the culture and relationships in the region?

Why do border conflicts and how do they impact the nations involved?
