NEW and REVISED COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ENGLISH 12 (REVISED) 2 sequential semesters 1 credit
304

Prerequisite: The student must already have earned 3 full English credits.

English 12 reinforces reading skills, comprehension skills, and usage of basic literary elements. The writing focuses on real world applications. Grammar and mechanics review is incorporated. Special attention is given to organizational skills, oral communication skills, information search, and group work activities. English 12 includes a focus on vocabulary. Areas of study may include Contemporary Literature and Mass Media. Students may be required to buy paperback books.

PREPARING FOR COLLEGE ENGLISH (NEW) 2 sequential semesters 1 credit
315

Prerequisite: A passing grade in any level of 10th or 11th grade English.

To prepare students for college, this course will focus on developing competencies in reading, speaking, and writing. Students will learn how to apply a variety of citation formats, including APA and MLA, as well as reading and evaluating sources for research. In addition to informational text, students will read and analyze short pieces of literature. Grammar and mechanics review will be incorporated as well as ACT/SAT prep and vocabulary enrichment. Students will practice writing college entrance and scholarship essays.

SPANISH III (Non CCP - High School Credit Only - NEW) 2 sequential semesters 1 credit
813

Prerequisite: Spanish II with a grade of "76" or better OR teacher approval.

This third year Spanish course is designed for the student working toward the Diploma with Honors or the student who does not want college credit for Spanish. Please note that students taking this course for their 3rd Spanish credit will not be eligible to take any subsequent Spanish language courses at Kenton Ridge. This course stresses the application of the four basic language skills of comprehension, conversation, reading, and writing. There is also emphasis on advanced grammar, culture, and history. Reading and discussion of selected texts with practice in speaking and writing the language. Singing and dancing is part of the cultural experience, therefore students are expected to participate as part of their grade.

ADVANCED WORLD HISTORY (NEW) 2 sequential semesters 1 credit
611

Prerequisite: Current Instructor Approval and an "A" or "B" final grade in 8th Grade American History

This course will cover modern world history, starting in the 1400s and going up until present day. This class is intended for students who are planning to take more advanced classes in their high school careers and eventually move into the CCP track of graduation. The class will not only cover content and material, but also historical thinking skills. These include thesis development, analyzing evidence, drawing conclusions from primary/secondary sources, proper citation methods, paper writing, and much more. This class is both reading and writing intensive. Students who take this class will leave with a much deeper understanding of the content, historical skills and college readiness skills, compared to the general level World History offered.

INTRODUCTION TO ECONOMICS (NEW)

1 Semester

½ credit

663A/B

Prerequisite: Successful completion of World and American History, along with at least “junior” level status.

This course will serve as an introduction to the increasingly complex world of economics. Understanding economics and the impact it has on associated fields is key to becoming a more informed citizen. Students will start with understanding what economics is, how it influences policy/decision making, and basic economic practices/theory. Students will then cover more complex concepts such as the many different aspects of Macroeconomics and Microeconomics. Students who take this course, combined with Careers and Financial Literacy and a Government course will have a deep understanding of these social sciences that influence their lives on a daily basis.

Does not count as Social Studies credit toward meeting graduation requirements. Can be used toward meeting Honors Diploma requirements.

COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS (CCP)

Courses identified as a CCP course offer students the opportunity to earn college and high school credit for courses offered at KR provided the student meets the criteria required for enrollment. In addition to the CCP powerpoints, information regarding CCP will be communicated via school announcements, the KR website, student assemblies, classrooms and via KR email (**students need to check their KR email regularly**). The student must submit the “Intent to Participate” form by April 1, each year, in order to participate in CCP.

Step 1: All students wanting to participate in College Credit Plus for the 2024-25 school year (**even if they participated in 2023-24**) can meet the information and counseling requirement by attending the Information Meeting which will be held in January/February every year. There will be two components – general information about CCP and information about CCP at Kenton Ridge. The powerpoint from the Information Meeting will be available on the KR website after the Informational Meeting is held. One powerpoint is general information about College Credit Plus that applies to all Ohio students; the other is specific to Kenton Ridge. Both powerpoints are expected to be viewed.

Step 2: Submit the “Intent to Participate” form to the Guidance Office, with parent and student signature, on or before April 1. This is a deadline established by the Ohio Department of Education. This form MUST be submitted by the deadline to be eligible to take ANY courses through the CCP program in 2024-25 including summer 2024. NOTE: Students are encouraged to get the forms submitted PRIOR to spring break since April 1 is the Monday, our first day back after Spring Break.

Step 3: Be sure to **meet the application and testing* requirements** for the college(s) you plan to attend or earn credit from. All of the CCP courses offered at KR are through Clark State so the Clark State application and testing requirements need to be met for the CCP courses at KR. An admission to Clark State’s CCP program should be submitted prior to being able to take the ACCUPLACER to meet the testing requirement.

*PLEASE LIST CLARK STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE AS ONE OF THE SCHOOLS TO RECEIVE YOUR ACT OR SAT SCORES. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE YOUR SCORES SENT DIRECTLY TO CLARK STATE THEN YOU WILL HAVE TO FILL OUT A FORM TO REQUEST THE GUIDANCE OFFICE SEND YOUR TEST SCORES.

Students taking college courses **at the college OR on-line** and will need to complete the application and testing process for that college PLUS schedule an orientation session (on-line for Clark State) or meet the requirements for the college(s) the student plan(s) to attend.

Please bring your college schedule to the Guidance Office on the days designated for schedule adjustments and plan to meet with Mrs. Young to finalize your KR schedule (typically the week prior to the first day of school-check your email for specific dates). When selecting courses at the college please use the bell schedule and allow time for travel & parking; use the 2 hour delay schedule for second semester and allow time for travel & parking. REMINDER: most colleges do not follow the same calendar as the school district so keep in mind that you will be expected to attend your college courses according to the college calendar (our spring break for example).

CCP students are responsible for making sure they do not exceed the “30” credits allowed which includes high school and college credits for summer, fall and spring semesters. (college credits + high school credits x3 ≤ 30) Student athletes taking CCP courses are responsible for making sure they meet athletic eligibility requirements.
