

Jessie Taken Alive-Rencountre

Jessie is a Hunkpapa Lakota from the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe. She has worked as a school counselor serving hundreds of students for 15 years. She was named the Great Plains Emerging Tribal Writer's Award winner for her first children's book *Pet'a Shows Misun the Light*.

Utilizing her teachings from her Lakota culture combined with a school counselor lens, she has published four children's books, with another being released in December 2023. Her passion is to help people remember their importance in life and to use their unique talents to create better communities for future generations to come. She is also a Lakota Jingle Dress Dancer and loves to educate others about Lakota culture using storytelling combined with traditional song and dance. In 2021, Jessie was named a future legacy leader by the Spirit Aligned Leadership Program.
