Other News / Community Partner Updates:

Gretchen Kolb-Cauble's advocacy has resulted in an offer by the Cape Cod Chronicle to fact check and print updated copies of the Lower Cape Family Resource Guide! She also let us know that the Chatham Community Center has a preschool size table and chairs to give to a program in need. Lucy will reach out to our community partners to ask if they can use this equipment. Gretchen asked about district dates for Kindergarten registration and requested advanced notice regarding dates for registration and orientations, etc. Christie Cutone said she will give them to me as soon as they are available. Gretchen wondered if elementary school teachers and/or administrators would be making visits to preschools? Perhaps a student ambassador (for a preschool student now Kindergartener) could accompany them?

Lucy Chrobak explained the Cape Cod Children's Place Wellspring Project:
Thanks to the SORPEC (State Opioid Response-Prevention in Early Childhood) grant and a workgroup made up of early childhood professionals in the community, the **Wellspring Project** was conceived. We have just begun the implementation stage and are very excited to put all of the research into action.

Our mission is to support a culture of resilience and social emotional wellness in young children ages 0-5 and the adults that care for them.

Through generous grant support, our program is able to provide cost free services that include the following:

- Professional Development Trainings around Social Emotional Learning (SEL) in response to needs and goals identified for each center (e.g. trauma aware and developmentally informed practices; creating sensory friendly environments)
- Resilience Coaching- Collaboration with educators and families to build strong
 relationships, create supportive environments and implement strategies that foster
 emotional regulation, problem solving and adaptability in children ages 0-5. Coaches will
 also support connection of new learning from Professional development to classroom
 practices and foster adult resilience.
- Social Emotional Community Programs Offered to bring in additional approaches and education tailored to the unique needs and goals of each early childhood classroom
- The Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) Program
 An assessment and planning system to promote children's social and emotional development. Designed with the specific intent to bridge the worlds of early childhood development and mental health, providing a common language that is strength-based, family friendly and developmentally appropriate.

The DECA program works to: (1) assess and build resilience in all children; (2) promote the resilience of the important adults in young children's lives; and (3) create environments that support resilience-building behaviors in children and adults.

Charles Gruszka reported that, as a community representative on the MRSD Strategic Plan Development Team, he was able to review the summaries from the various Focus Groups that were held to start that process, and could see the input from those in the Early Childhood community who participated in the Community Focus Group reflected in the report. The Planning Team has drafted Mission, Vision, and Core Values statements and will be turning its attention to developing Strategic Goals and Objectives for the upcoming years.
