Scholarship Donation Credit

To qualify for the Scholarship Donation Credit, you must make a monetary donation in 2023 to an eligible scholarship granting organization (SGO). The credit equals the lesser of \$750 or the total amount you donated to SGOs during the tax year. If you are filing a joint return and both you and your spouse make eligible donations, each of you can claim this credit (up to \$1,500 total). [Learn More](#)

You also can include amounts donated by April 15, 2024.
