1. Application & Code of Conduct (1 sheet, 2-sided)
2. Letter of Intent – this letter should be addressed to the Student Activities Director at Lathrop High School, Mrs. Birakos. The letter should be typed and no more than two pages, double-spaced. Please ask your English teacher for help, if you need it. This letter should include the following:
 - Why you want to be in Leadership
 - Characteristics you feel are important to be a successful team member
 - Improvements you can make to become a better leader
 - A service project that you have been involved in and how it impacted you
 - Any other personal information that you would like us to know

Article IV Section 4 Duties of Selected Officers	<u>Officers :</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Presides at any meetings the class he/she represents 2. Represents the views of his/her class when called to do so 3. Responsible for planning Homecoming Activities with assigned committee 4. Oversees class-sponsored activities or when necessary, delegates the responsibility to a fellow class member (Proms, fundraisers etc...) 5. Maintains the minutes of any class meetings and makes them available to the leadership advisor, fellow classmates, and administration if requested 6. Meets regularly with Class Advisor to update all plans and proper paperwork, ensures class paperwork is completed in a timely and well written fashion 7. Oversee the use of purchase orders to pay for class-sponsored activities with the help of advisors 8. Provide a financial statement of class funds during Student Council meetings 9. Present when selling at events and make deposit immediately following event 10. Oversee the Class Instagram, provide pictures of class events and functions to social media & publicity 11. Actively encourage student engagement in school activities 12. Work with grade alike members to create & update quarterly Presidents grades

Student Council Code of Conduct

Leadership at Lathrop High School is a privilege. Leadership students represent Lathrop High School in the community as well as on the school campus. As a leadership student you agree to follow this below code of conduct.

- * All leadership students are expected to represent LHS in a positive manner and to work effectively with students, faculty, and administration.

- * Students may be placed on probationary status when any of the items listed below occur. Probationary status will involve the student attending all leadership class, committee meetings and any other activities, as assigned. The second violation will result in the removal of the student from the leadership class.
 1. Receiving less than a 2.5 GPA. This includes all grading periods. Students shall remain on probation until grades improve to a 2.5 GPA.
 2. Uncooperative attitude with fellow classmates, advisor, faculty or administration.
 3. Violation of school regulations
 4. Lack of participation in Leadership activities, including required classes activities and class periods
 5. Conduct inappropriate of a Leadership Student
 6. Disrespectful and disagreeable behavior towards the advisor, faculty, administration, and other students.
 7. Unwillingness to follow guidelines given by the leadership advisor

- * Faculty and administration may request a student be removed from class for violating these guidelines.

- * Parents shall be notified of any concerns about their child's behavior and shall have the right to request a meeting with the leadership advisor and other school officials to discuss the removal their child from class.
