CURRICULUM

LNHS is a comprehensive high school with over 200 courses emphasizing college preparation. Special focus is placed on AP and Honors courses, as well as, the Arts. The district is also a national model for an innovative engineering and biomedical sciences program entitled *Project Lead the Way*. A variety of internship opportunities in health careers, engineering, business and digital media are also available to students.

GRADING/TRANSCRIPTS

Credit is awarded on a per-semester basis at the end of December and May. GPA is computed each semester and cumulatively at the end of grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. GPA is calculated on a non-weighted, four-point scale. Advanced and Honors courses are not given additional point values, but are noted by the course title. Open access is allowed to all Honors and AP classes.
