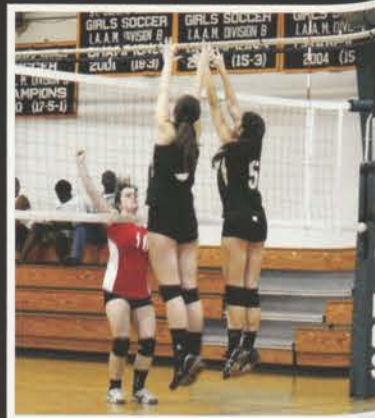
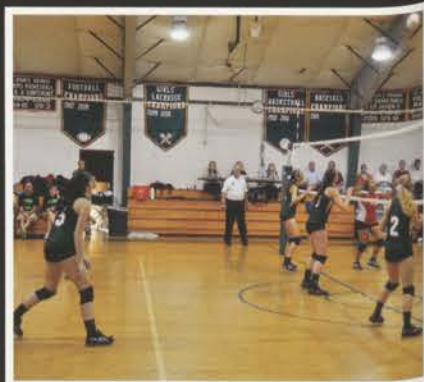
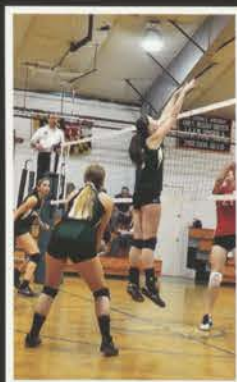
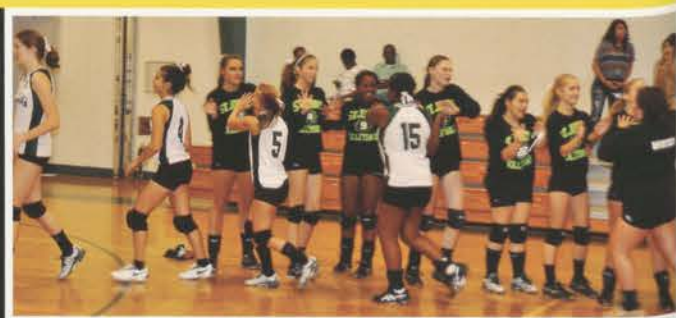
Time for an Ace... Volleyball

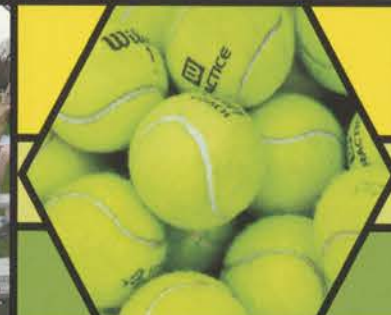
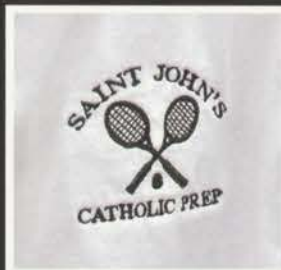


Serve Time... Tennis

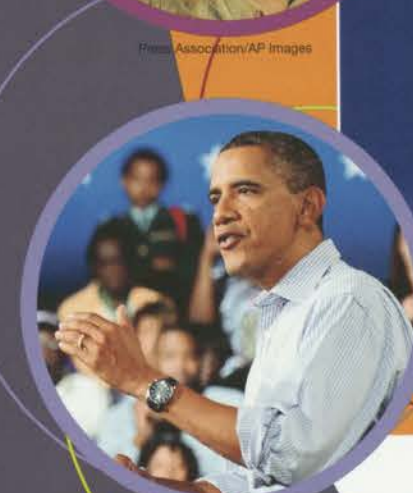
It is time to look back at the history of this place that has been home to Saint John's since the first class entered the mansion in the fall of 1958.

Built on the highest elevation in the city of Frederick known as Red Hill, the historic Prospect Hall Mansion and grounds encompassed over 8000 acres of countryside in the early days. It was built by Daniel Dulaney, the man that laid out the city called Fredericktowne. Construction started in the late 1790's and was completed around 1810. This structure was widely known as the most important home in western Maryland. The most notable early visitor to the estate was George Washington. Dulaney gave him his horse Blueskin, that he rode in the Revolutionary War. George loved the horse so much that when the war was finished, he returned the horse to Prospect Hall to live out his days. It is rumored that the horse is buried in the front lawn of the mansion and that it's ghost has been heard galloping around the campus on Washington's birthday! During the Civil War, the mansion was the site of General Meade's takeover of the Army of the Potomac from General Joseph Hooker immediately before the Battle of Gettysburg. It also served as an Army Hospital during the Battles of Antietam, South Mountain, Harper's Ferry and Monocacy. Other visitors to the mansion include the Marquis de Lafayette, Father John McElroy, the founder of Saint John's and President Harry Truman. In 1958, the Archdiocese of Baltimore purchased the mansion from it's owner, Senator Himes. Grades 9 through 12 from Saint John's Literary Institution were moved from downtown Frederick to the new site. The Sisters of Notre Dame ran the school until 1972, when it was sold and became the first independent Catholic School in Maryland. In 1979, the mansion was named to the National Register of Historic Places. It is amazing that so much history has taken place at this location! For fifty-four years, the thousands of graduates at Saint John's have been the greatest "guests" at this distinguished mansion. These students left through the front gate, educated and prepared to take on new challenges on their journey through life. No one that steps foot on this campus will ever forget it...it becomes a part of who they are!

The story of the Prospect Hall Mansion has had many chapters in it's history. Wonder how the next chapter will start?!

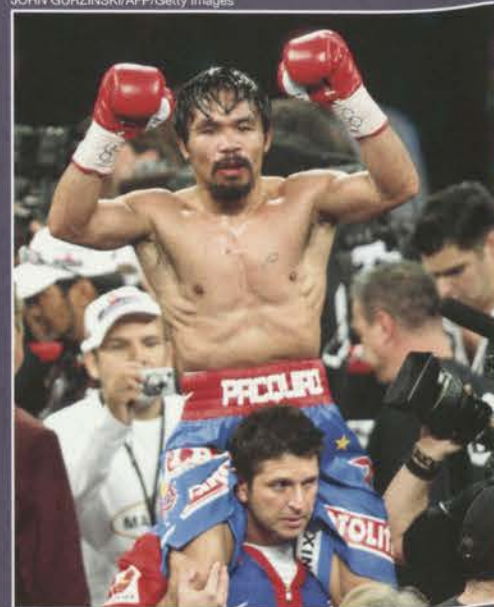
