








Principal moment


A NEW KIND OF DANCE

DRIVE-BY PARTIES

Across North America, people take to their vehicles to connect and celebrate without violating social distancing rules. Drive-by baby showers, birthday celebrations and even graduations become the norm.



Grandparents and other older relatives are at higher risk of serious COVID-19 effects, so families work hard to keep them safe by staying away. This proves a hardship for everyone, especially on holidays and special occasions. FaceTime, Zoom and Skype allow relatives to at least talk face-to-face when they cannot be together and help lessen feelings of isolation and loneliness.

VACCINES DEVELOPED

Over 140 possible COVID-19 vaccines are in development by December 2020, the shortest vaccine development timeline in history. The first two to get U.S. approval use the COVID-19 genome to create messenger RNA (mRNA), leading host cells and the resulting antibodies.

CITIZENS DELIVER PPE

As the number of COVID-19 cases rises dramatically in Washington state, New York City and New Jersey, hospital staffers and nursing home workers face shortages of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). State governments struggle to meet the needs of healthcare professionals, and ordinary Americans rush to help.

QUARANTINE COMPANIONS

Dog and cat adoptions increase dramatically, probably a result of families and individuals spending more time at home. In many states, animal shelters actually run out of adoptable pets.

THANK YOU ESSENTIAL WORKERS

Stay-at-home orders did not apply to "essential" or "front-line" workers who include teachers, medical personnel, firefighters, utilities workers, law enforcement officers, military personnel, meat packers, farm workers, grocery employees, and countless others.



SPACE X LIFTOFF

In the first NASA partnership with a private corporation, Elon Musk's Space X company, the first astronauts head to the International Space Station. Lifting off in Space X's "Crew Dragon," U.S. astronauts go into orbit on a U.S.—built rocket for the first time in nine years. They will spend six months in space, joining another NASA astronaut and two Russian cosmonauts.

VIRAL VIDEO PROMPTS PROTESTS

Citizens protest after the posting of a video of Minneapolis, MN resident George Floyd's death while in police custody. The video goes viral, prompting protests in cities across the United States, Canada and the globe, including England, Germany, Denmark, New Zealand and Japan, among others.

SUPREME WOMEN

Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg. path-breaking Associate Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, dies of cancer in September. Ginsburg, one of nine women entering Harvard Law School in 1956, argued six landmark gender discrimination cases. President Trump nominates Amy Coney Barrett to replace Ginsburg, making her the 5th female associate iustice.

TITLE VII LAWSUIT

The U.S. Women's National Soccer Team's claim that their working conditions are not equal to those of the U.S. Men's Team leads to a settlement in their favor. U.S. Soccer agrees to provide both teams with comparable charter flights and hotel accommodations, along with staffing numbers.

MAIL-IN VOTING

Despite COVID-19 restrictions, a record number of people vote in November, as states allow more early voting or voting by absentee ballot. Counting absentee ballots delays election results for days, leading some to challenge the results and demand state recounts. Eventually, all 50 states certify election results and Joe Biden is declared the official winner of the presidential election.

OLYMPICS POSTPONED

The Tokyo Summer Olympics are postponed until 2021, but that is good news for young athletes such as gymnast Konnor McClain, who was too young to compete in the 2020 games but will turn 16 in time to compete in 2021. This is the first time that the Olympics have been postponed since WWII.



The November formation of Tropical Storm Theta, the 29th tropical storm of the 2020 season, makes the Atlantic storm season the most active on record. The predetermined list of 21 names based on the Roman alphabet ends with "Wilfred" on September 18th.

Although hurricane names have gone into the Greek alphabet before, "Theta" marks the first time storm naming delves that far into the secondary alphabet list.



FIRES RAGE

The United States experiences a record-setting wildfire season. According to the National Interagency Fire Center, over 10 million acres burn in 2020, fueled by record heat combined with tropical storm-related thunderstorms pushing into the West. In the process, they destroy 10,500 buildings in California alone. On Sept. 8 and 9, the skies along the western coast of the U.S. turn an unearthly shade of red-orange because of nearby fires and smoke.

CIVIL RIGHTS ICON DIES

John Lewis, Congressman from Georgia and veteran civil rights leader, dies in July. As a young man, Lewis led the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee and was also a Freedom Rider in the 1960s.

STOCK ROLLER COASTER

COVID-19 affects the stock market throughout 2020. The Dow Jones Industrial Index falls almost 8 percent on March 10th and then 10 percent on March 12th, 2020, as news of COVID-19 spreads and oil prices fall. Still, stock prices climb overall for the year and the Dow Jones Industrial Average sees an overall return of over 8 percent as of December.

46TH PRESIDENT

Joseph R. Biden becomes President of the United States after record voter turnout in this one-of-a-kind pandemic election. Due to the large numbers of absentee ballots cast, media outlets do not declare Biden the winner until the Saturday following the election. Although Biden leads the popular vote by 5 percent, sitting President Donald Trump challenges state-level results with multiple lawsuits, and civil unrest occurs at the capitol on January 6 as electoral college votes are being tallied. Nonetheless, Biden proceeds with his transition team, naming an all-female White House communications team and pledging to name the "most diverse cabinet in history."



VICE PRESIDENT HARRIS

Kamala Harris, the daughter of immigrants from India and Haiti, becomes the first African American and Asian American woman to win the Vice Presidency. Harris previously served as a California U.S. Senator and Attorney General, Her husband, Doug Emhoff, will also be a first - the first "Second Gentleman" of the United States.

TRAVEL CURTAILED


Airlines lost more than 50 percent of their normal business in 2020, as passengers avoided congested flight conditions and many tourist destinations, like Disneyland and Walt Disney World, shut down temporarily. Airports emptied. In response, airlines cut flight schedules, furloughed employees, and advertised new safety procedures. Forbes reported that travelers viewed Delta as the safest airline because of procedures such as leaving middle seats empty and restricting capacity. Some airlines continued to fly full flights, despite research showing airborne virus transmissions.



HEADLINES

SUPER BOWL 55

Tampa Bay wins their second title, defeating the Kansas City Chiefs, as the Buccaneers' defense and quarterback Tom Brady dominate. The matchup was a battle between the greatest quarterback of all time and the current best, Patrick Mahomes. At 43 years old, Brady is the oldest player to ever play in the Super Bowl. The game is his 10th Super Bowl and he set NFL records with this seventh win and fifth MVP. The halftime show featured entertainer The Weeknd.





Decisions about sports cancellations or delays are left to local governments and school districts, leading to agonizing backand-forths. Student athletes, coaches, and school boards ride an emotional roller coaster throughout the year. A handful of states cancel fall sports completely, while others delay the season's start or move fall sports to the spring. Parent protests often convince local governments to reverse unpopular decisions. Although many states do not initially change fall schedules. COVID-19 outbreaks lead to unplanned delays.

SPORTS



NCAA FOOTBALL CHAMP

Alabama dominated Ohio State 55-24 in the January College Football National Championship. The undefeated No. 1 Crimson Tide, led by Heisman Trophy-winner Devonta Smith, who scored three touchdowns, won their 18th national title.

MAN OF IRON Special Olympics athlete Chris Nikic becomes

the first person with Down syndrome to complete a full Ironman. Competing in the Ironman Florida, 21-year-old Nikic swims 2.4 miles, bikes 112 miles and runs a full marathon (26.2 miles), despite falling off his bike and being attacked by ants at a rest stop. Ironman's Facebook page live-streamed the last two miles of Nikic's run.



FAN SUBSTITUTES

COVID-19 social distancing restrictions limit professional and college sports stadium attendance, and teams come up with creative alternatives, including stuffed animals and cardboard cutouts. Fans can purchase "season tickets" allowing them to display their images on cardboard cutouts in the seats.



STANLEY CUP NHL playoffs are postponed to September, then limited to two locations in Canada, Toronto and Edmonton, due to COVID-19. The

Bay defenseman Victor Hedman was
named Series MVP.

MLB WORLD SERIES

Concluding the shortest MLB season on record, the Dodgers win the World Series after the Tampa Bay Rays make a controversial pitching change in Game 6, breaking Blake Snell's momentum in favor of reliever Nick Anderson. Mookie Betts slides home to give the Dodgers the go-ahead 2-1 run and the Dodgers win 3-1. COVID-19 impacts both teams, pulling starting Dodgers third-baseman Justin Turner out in the 8th inning after a positive test result but sending Rays Randy Arozarena back in to hit a first-inning home run.

MLS SEASON ADAPTS

COVID-19 challenges plague Major League
Soccer, starting with a temporary shutdown two
weeks into the season. Despite regular testing and
requirements to wear a mask if exposed, multiple
games are postponed or cancelled due to positive
COVID-19 tests. Game cancellations lead the MLS to
determine playoff spots based on points per game
rather than win-loss standings. MLS Cup Match takes
place Dec. 12 between Columbus Crew SC and the
Seattle Sounders. Columbus Crew wins the Cup 3-0.



LeBron James wins his fourth Finals MVP award, tying Michael Jordan for that record, after a win over the Miami Heat. The Lakers win follows a tough year with the loss of former team leader Kobe Bryant. The team dedicates the season to him.

LITTLE LEAGUE WORLD SERIES

For the first time in 73 years, Williamsport, PA, does not host the Little League World Series, due to COVID-19.





WNBA CHAMPS

Sweeping the Las Vegas Aces in a best-of-five series, the Seattle Storm wins the 2020 WNBA Championship in an unprecedented season. The teams played season games in the Bradenton, FL "wubble" (WNBA bubble). Forward Breanna Stewart, who missed the 2019 season due to a torn Achilles tendon, was unanimously voted MVP for the championship



TIK TOK DODGES BAN

Concerns about national security leads President Trump to threaten to prohibit Chinese-owned TikTok downloads starting in November. Oracle proposes taking over ownership of TikTok U.S. data, and negotiations continue through the fall. Two federal district court judges rule that Trump's emergency economic powers are not sufficient.

U.S. SUES GOOGLE

The U.S. Department of Justice files a lawsuit against tech giant Google after a Congressional report accuses Google, Twitter, Amazon and others of using monopoly powers. The DOJ claims that Google has illegally paid computer manufacturers billions of dollars to choose Google as their default search engine and restrict rivals.

MICROSOFT NEUTRALIZES HACKERS

In December, evidence of the most sophisticated and far-reaching hack in years became public. A group of hackers known as "CozyBear" breached a trusted infrastructure supply chain. While Microsoft could not fix the damage already done, they were able to prevent further infiltration within four days.

HOME ENTERTAINMENT

With movie theaters shuttered and shelter-in-place orders common, home entertainment becomes more important than ever. Technology continues to enhance social gatherings as platforms like Zoom video conferencing and the Occulus Quest virtual reality headset become more common.



SEE YOU ON ZOOM

The Zoom app goes from being a business-meeting app to an "everything" app in 2020, used for virtual learning, social gatherings, art performances, exercise classes, weddings and funerals. As of December 2020, downloading stats put Zoom far ahead of other apps like Skype and Google Hangouts and second only to TikTok.



NOBEL PRIZE

Charpentier win the Nobel Prize in Chemistry for their work developing a gene-editing technique known as Crispr-Cas9. Crispr stands for "clustered regularly interspaced short palindromic repeats," a type of sequencing in DNA chains that facilitates bacterial immunity. The Crispr technique allows scientists to cut out and replace chain segments. This will enable repairs to flawed genes and prevent diseases, but the technique's potential to create inheritable edited genes in humans is controversial.



GAMERS' DILEMMA

Sony and Microsoft release their newest gaming systems on the same day, November 12th. Microsoft's Xbox Series X and Sony's PlayStation 5 both offer much faster loading times than their predecessors and are similarly priced at about \$500. However, Xbox Series X offers better backward capability, while PS5 offers a redesigned, more immersive controller. Which to buy? Depends on your game preference: Halo fans prefer the Xbox, while God of War fans want the PS5. Getting PS5 for the holidays proves so difficult that it inspires a Saturday Night Live skit.
