
Hello SHS Families and Students,



SCHOOL COUNSELING DEPARTMENT UPDATE

The SHS School Counseling Department has been implementing many events over the course of the last couple months to support students on their post-secondary planning journey.

- On November 30 we hosted our Virtual College/Future Planning Night. This event provided students and families with important information for the process and next steps for postsecondary planning.
- In December SHS School Counselors followed up College and Future Planning Night with visits to Junior Advisories. In preparing for the advisory lessons, Juniors were sent the College/Future Planning presentation and asked through a survey to provide questions in advance. SHS School Counselors worked with a team of SHS seniors to join them in the lessons, using the survey questions to guide the conversations and share process, next steps and senior experiences.
- School Counselors are currently meeting with all students/families for Course Selection for the 2024-2025 school year. Course Selection meetings will end on February 9th.




