The Royals will also have the following events, activities and programs (among others), going on throughout February:

• TIME Magazine Influential People Display: This display will live in the Heart of the school for the month of February. It will feature a collection of TIME magazine covers, each with an influential African American on it. Students will be able to access the cover stories about each of these individuals. - Connecting with Influencers & Leaders (Dining Hall): During lunches throughout the month, students will be able to engage with leaders in the black community through poster displays and other visuals.
- Morning Announcements: Each day, the student-led morning announcements will highlight a different iconic African American, along with their contributions and achievements.
- Library Displays: Visit the Library to check out featured books, watch videos and listen to a Black History playlist. The dynamic book display will feature an array of information related to Black History Month throughout February.
