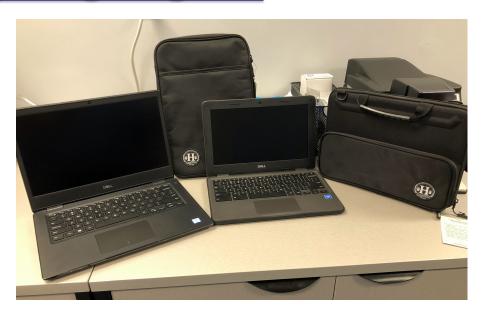

2020-2021 Technology Highlights

District Technology

- Implemented One to One student Initiative 6-12 (Approx. 1350 devices)
- Implemented a staff PC one to one initiative 6-12 (Approx. 300 devices)
- Completed network infrastructure upgrade (switches)
- Added 2nd internet service for redundancy
- Doubled our bandwidth for improved performance (from 500 mg to 1G)
- Purchased and implemented document cameras for virtual instruction
- Implemented new technology to allow for streaming of all indoor athletic events
- Built Custom Computers for HHS STEM Lab

Tax Levy



In 2013 the Hawthorne Board of Education elected to move the annual school board election from April to November, eliminating the annual vote on the proposed general tax levy that is at the statutory 2% tax levy cap.

The tax increase from 2020/21 to 2021/22 is \$108.92 per year or \$9.08 per month

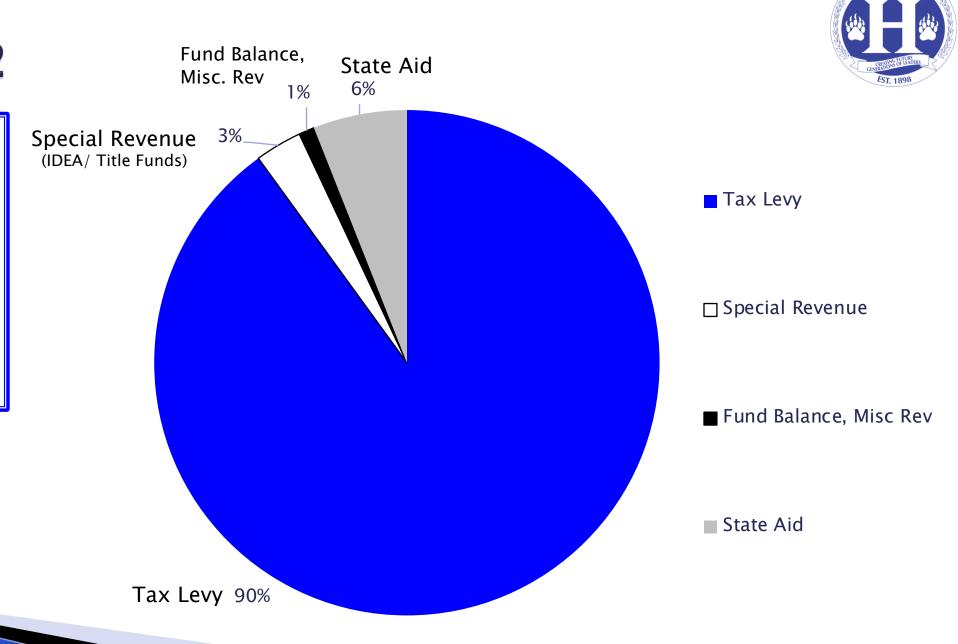

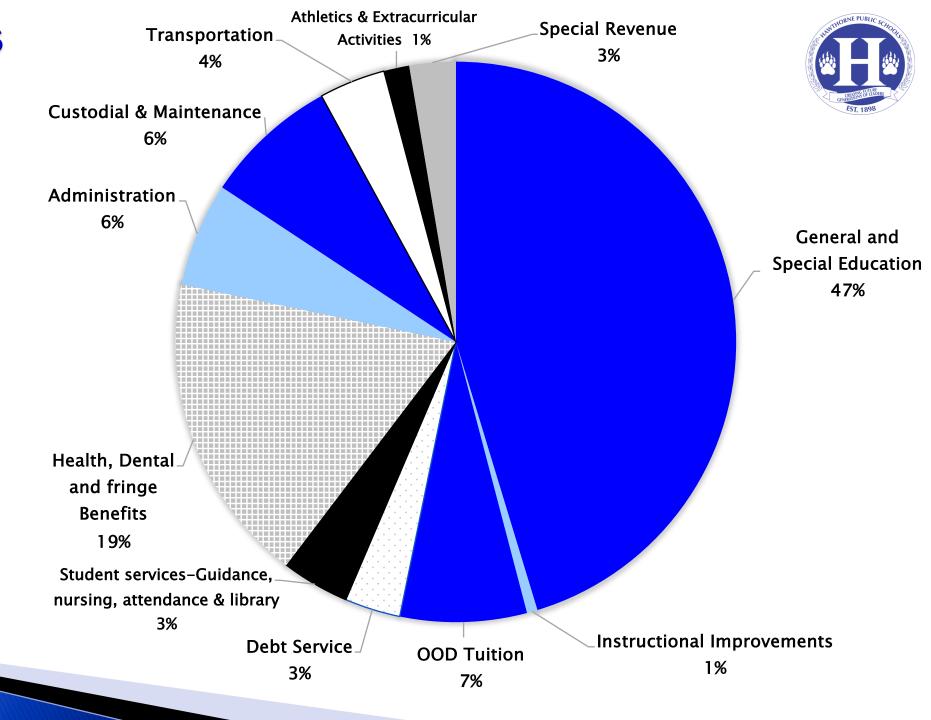

Curriculum and Instruction

At Hawthorne High School, the 2021-2022 budget will . . .

- Maintain current academic programs and AP course offerings
- Support the development of curriculum for the following new courses:

 Latin American Studies, Robotics and App Design, Study Skills, Social Justice
- Support curricular revisions for the following courses: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Anatomy and Physiology, Forensic Science, Genetics, All levels of Spanish, Italian, Visual and Performing Arts
- Allow for purchase new AP Biology textbooks
- Provide continued professional development opportunities to all staff, including the summer AP institute for 6 high school teachers







Curriculum and Instruction

At the Lincoln Middle School, the 2021-2022 budget will...

- Allow for the purchase of Gizmos for Math and Science
- Fund curriculum revisions in: *Math, Science, Health, Visual and Performing Arts, Italian and Spanish*
- Support the creation of a new Study Skills course (LMS and HHS)
- Allow for the purchase of Envisions 2020 Math Series for grades 6-8
- Provide continued professional development opportunities to all staff, including Kiker Learning technology training and training for new Math program.







Curriculum and Instruction

At the district elementary schools, the 2020-2021 budget will

- Allow for the revision of Research and Exploration course grades K-5
- Support the purchase of 165 ipads for use by our Kindergarten students
- Support the purchase of Envisions 2020 Math Series for grades K-5
- ▶ Allow for curriculum revisions in: *K-5 Science, K-5 Visual and Performing Arts, and K-5 World Language*
- Provide continued professional development opportunities to all staff,
 including Conquer Mathematics training and training for new math series









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
