Greetings Carmel High School (IN) seniors! We are pleased to consider you for a Carmel Education Foundation (CEF) Scholarship. CEF Scholarships have a wide range of criteria and focus areas, and up to 100 students will receive a scholarship. You will likely qualify for several CEF scholarships, however, each applicant may only receive one scholarship from CEF. Every scholarship has unique criteria. General categories are listed below, by color, for your reference. If a scholarship has criteria in multiple categories, there is a color bar to the right indicating this.

It is recommended that you identify which scholarships you qualify for to be prepared to respond to relevant questions (i.e. club participation, service organizations, etc.). Some scholarships require a short essay which is included in this directory. **All application materials must be submitted by 5:00 pm EST, March 1, 2024. There will be no exceptions.**

The application is a three-part process:

- * **PART ONE**- Create an account in Kaleidoscope to complete a general application (link on CEF website). You may save and edit the application as needed until 5:00 pm EST, March 1, 2024.
- * **PART TWO**- Answer a series of questions to determine which scholarships you qualify for.
- * **PART THREE**- Review the scholarships you qualify for.
- * **If a scholarship requires an essay, a recommendation, or an upload**, simply click on the title to respond to the question. You may also pin a draft to your account for later review.
- * If no essay, recommendation or upload is required, you will automatically be considered for that scholarship.

To get started, please make sure you have these necessary items:

- * An email address that you regularly check and is not a CCS address (no parent addresses).
- * If you would like to be considered for scholarships that have a financial need criteria, please have a **screenshot/image of your FAFSA submission email or confirmation including the Student Aid Index (SAI)** from your [2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA) application. **FAFSA application opens December 2023- you may upload your submission email or confirmation (any file type) at any time before March 1, 2024.** FAFSA forms will only be viewed by CEF staff for verification. *Note: CEF is aware of the current FAFSA challenges and will provide applicants with next steps on how to submit their FAFSA documentation if not available at time of application. This communication to applicants will take place after the application deadline and will include an alternate way to submit this documentation to CEF.*
- * A list, in priority order, of colleges, universities, trade schools, or certification programs you have applied to. CEF will connect with all applicants to verify your commitments after May 1, 2024.
