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
WHY NOW?

As district leaders, our primary goal is always to provide the highest educational opportunities to our communities while also trying to be fiscally responsible to all our taxpayers. Over the past several years, the board has strategically managed the district tax levy by paying off debt, identifying additional funding opportunities, applying for grants and other ways to do more for the district, and minimizing any tax impact. As our infrastructure ages and our enrollment increases, now is the right time to invest in our children's future. The district listened to the completed community-wide survey and developed a solution that was overwhelmingly supported by our community.

ZERO TAX IMPACT


The District has historically managed its' debt payments, periodically prepaying existing debt with the goal of maintaining a stable tax levy. Presently, the District has the opportunity to borrow additional funds with minimal impact to the tax levy. New debt payments will "wrap around" existing debt payments and the debt levy will not increase.

BALLOT QUESTION

Shall the School District of Abbotsford, Clark and Marathon Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$17,000,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school facility improvement project at the Middle/High School and Elementary School building consisting of: construction of additions, including for a safe and secure entrance, classrooms and a library; renovations, including to classrooms, the technical education area and district offices; safety, security, building infrastructure, systems, parking and site improvements; technology and ADA accessibility updates; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?



REFERENDUM SCOPE OF WORK

1. Add six classrooms to the middle school / high school and two elementary classrooms
2. Build an entrance / middle-high school office to better monitor access and improve safety and security
3. Update major building systems (includes plumbing / piping and boilers)
4. Renovate existing office area into meeting rooms and special education support spaces
5. Update HVAC systems in the agriculture area, replace ventilation in the welding lab, and add cooling in the north gym
6. Renovate the tech ed area (woods and metals) to help prepare students for high-demand jobs
7. Update restrooms to comply with current ADA regulations and convert another into additional classrooms
8. Re-purpose the data / server room into a business education space
9. Replace technology infrastructure
10. Expand the receiving / maintenance area and add freezer / cooler equipment
11. Add approximately 45 parking spots at the middle/high school
12. Create pick-up / drop-off lanes at the high school to better separate pedestrians and vehicles
13. Relocate and expand the library to support student group work and improve access to virtual education courses from local colleges / universities
14. Replace the pool's ventilation system
15. Replace ventilation and irrigation systems in the greenhouse
