#### WIG Bulletin Board

This week our DPS WIG (or Wildly Important Goal) bulletin board was posted by the library thanks to members of the academic action team (Seana Kowal, Bridget Blodgett, Mary Debasitis, Chris Spoor, and Alex Wampole) along with Kristen Pullen and Meaghan Bell. Each grade level has identified WIGS and we'll track the students' progress from September to June.

The Reading WIGS for each grade level are:

- <u>4PK</u> identify the letters in their name out of order and provide the letter sound for the first letter of their name
- <u>Kindergarten</u> know all letter sounds
- 1st Grade learn at least 100 new high frequency/snap words

 <u>2nd Grade</u> - improve oral reading fluency (ability to read with speed, accuracy, and proper expression)

The Math WIGS for each grade level are:

- 4PK count a set of objects 0-5 and match it to the corresponding numeral
- <u>Kindergarten</u> plus and minus patterns (ex what is one more, what is one less)
- <u>1st Grade</u> fluently solve addition problems (through conceptual learning, fact strategies, and memorization)
- <u>2nd Grade</u> fluently solve addition problems (through conceptual learning, fact strategies, and memorization)

# Winter Snow Sensory Bin

This month we have fake snow in our sensory bin!
By combining baking soda and shaving cream, we are able to mold the ingredients into perfect snowballs, snowmen, and more. Sensory bins are great for stimulating the senses, increasing hand strength, socializing with peers, cognitive development, and language development!

# Kristoff's Ice Chipping Business

In the movie *Frozen*, Kristoff is in the ice business!
We are helping him out this week in Pre-K by hammering golf tees into styrofoam blocks, we call it chipping the ice!
This is a little bit of fun and a LOT of hand-eye coordination and fine motor development.



# Roll and Add Snow Globe

This math center focuses on quantity recognition, subitizing and making groups! These cute glittery pom poms make our snow globes perfectly winter. What a great way to review numbers 1-5 before moving on to 6-10!



# Elsa's Number Ice Explosion

This center combines fine motor skills with number identification and counting! Pick a number out of the bin, identify it, then add that many beads to the "tree." Picking up the tiny manipulatives (beads, crushed ice vase filler, number erasers) make this center a crowd favorite. The "tree" is a head scratcher from dollar tree! Just stick it in a can of playdoh so it doesn't fall over!



## Kitchen Dramatic Play

This month we transitioned back into the play kitchen after having an Elf Workshop in December. Dramatic play lends itself to so many skills! It helps us express creativity and imagination while working on fine motor skills, visual recognition, numeracy, social skills, synergy, and language/communication.



# Snow Painting

This weekend's snowfall made the perfect canvas for us today in Pre-K! We got to use water color paints to make rainbow snow! We practice cooperative play/language skills (sharing, "please," "thank you," etc.) alongside brushing up on our color knowledge!



# Arendelle Snow Tracing

Elsa and Anna heard that we have finished talking about all of our uppercase letters — they sent us some special snow from the north pole to help us practice tracing our letters! It never melts; snowmen letters LOVE it!

#### **Arrival**

All **4PK-2nd grade students** will enter at the main entrance of school and must be to school by 8:00.

- Students can be dropped off as early as 7:15.
- Breakfast will be served from 7:30-8:10.
- Buses unload students at 7:40.

All 3PK students will enter at the side door at 9:00 for the AM program or 12:30 for the PM program.

#### **Dismissal**

Dismissal changes must be made *before 1:00pm*. Parent pick-up will begin at 2:15pm each day at the following doors based on last name. Please make sure we have the name of the person picking up and that person has a *driver's license for identification*.

- A-C at the ELC doorway on the parking lot side
- <u>D-H</u> at the back playground door
- I-Q at the first door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS
- R-Z at the second door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS

All 3PK AM and PM students will exit at the side door at 11:30 for the AM program and 3:00 for the PM program. Our 3PK students are dropped off and picked up in the small Primary Bus Loop during the following times: 8:45-9:00, 11:20-11:35, 12:20-12:30, and 2:50-3:05. Please consider parking in a different location so that you aren't trapped in the loop.


