- goals. Mrs. Kim also stressed the importance of discovering activi-
- ties or pursuits that can fill one's life with joy! One student soccer player decided to strive and become a *stronger* soccer player. Another child set a goal of simply *smiling* more often, and a third student decided to help at home by walking the dog more often.

The next step was creating a vision board that encapsulates each student's goals. By gathering images and deciding on written phrases, the vision board becomes an inspiration and a motivating factor for the student—in this case, to increase their participation in reaching their stated goals. This was also the perfect time for a mini-lesson about Google docs. The Fourth Graders learned



how to use key words to search and locate images that reflect their goals. After re-sizing, printing, and cutting out their images, the students created the layout of their boards, adding written phrases and drawing additional items. The boards have been displayed in the Fourth Grade classroom windows, and of course, each board includes the year 2024 in large numbers!

Several weeks after the vision boards were created, student feedback illustrates the value of this project as each child strives for personal improvement.

"One of my goals was trying new foods," shared a Fourth Grader, "because this is important as you get older. I told my parents about my goal, and I tried spinach and cauliflower—only cooked spinach and the cauliflower slightly cooked with a little salt. I discovered that I really like both!"

We often go to areas where residents have complained about speeding, and we issue tickets to help violators remember the rules. Also, there is no such thing as ticket quotas for deputies to meet!"

At the conclusion of his presentation, Deputy Clotworthy asked, "Would you like to see my patrol car?" Students eagerly walked out to our parking area to hear the Deputy explain the inner workings of his vehicle as well as all the gear and supplies inside. With genuine expressions of "Thank you!" our PHS students returned to class, more fully aware of the ongoing work of our community helpers in the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.
