Prior Park Schools is a family of Christian schools based in Bath and Gibraltar. Together, the Schools offer education for pupils aged between 3 and 18. Since the establishment of Prior Park College in 1830, the family has grown, with The Paragon School joining in 2006, and Prior Park School Gibraltar being opened by Prior Park Schools in 2016.

The Schools' Mission is to steward a thriving family of communities with love for the young people they serve at their heart. These vibrant communities cultivate creativity, foster integrity, and transform lives.

Across three sites, the Schools educate over 1100 young people of all faiths and none. Our Schools provide excellent teaching, equipping our young people to leave for a variety of exciting destinations. The Department

Our English department is a dynamic and enthusiastic team of teachers who develop a lifelong passion for language and literature through the study of various texts. Fostering a love for reading and literature is at the heart of our department. Our aim is to enable children to express themselves creatively and imaginatively as they become enthusiastic and critical readers of stories, poetry, and drama, as well as non-fiction and media texts.

The average set sizes are: KS3 - 22 Students KS4 - 16 Students KS5 – 6 Students

Curriculum and Results

Our Key Stage 3 curriculum aims to be rich, diverse, and challenging, while offering all students access to it. Every year, KS3 students study fiction, non-fiction, Shakespeare, Poetry, and Modern Drama. We assess students' attainment twice a year, in November and in May. In addition to this, the students are given many opportunities to individually research certain topics and prepare speaking presentations in class.

At Key Stage 4, students prepare for WJEC GCSE examinations in English Language, the content for which is taught through Years 10 and 11 with units of work on each of the core key skills needed for the Language GCSE Oracy NEA and exams. For Literature, we follow the OxfordAQA iGCSE syllabus, which is extremely suitable when choosing set texts for each of the three different ability groups.

English Literature is a popular A Level subject, and the OCR GCE specification is very much enjoyed by our students as it embraces a range of feminist, historical, colonialist, Marxist and psychoanalytical literary criticism of Ibsen, Chaucer, Shakespeare, Larkin, Carter, Stoker, McEwan and Williams.

Resources and Accommodation

The department has three classrooms in the main teaching block equipped with TV screens, whiteboards and storage cupboards with departmental resources.

A wide variety of online services are also available to students to allow them to further their learning beyond the four walls of the classroom. Teachers utilise Microsoft 365 software, in particular Teams, Microsoft SharePoint, and Microsoft OneDrive in the delivery of all lessons, and in the monitoring and tracking pupil progress. All students in the department bring personal learning devices to lessons and use this as their normal way of working. Additionally, all teaching staff are issued with Acer TravelMate devices, with digital pens, to help with their teaching. Prior Park Schools use Office 365 as our learning platform, and all teaching staff are expected to have, or be working towards, the Microsoft Innovative Educator award. At present, we use OneDrive and Teams as our main learning tools, with other Office 365 apps as required, e.g. Word, PowerPoint and Excel.

Extra-Curricular Activities and Trips

The English Department organises and runs many local and international educational trips and visits. Last Autumn, GCSE students visited London and attended a performance of Macbeth at The Globe Theatre. There is also the annual performance and workshop of the Young Shakespeare Company visiting Gibraltar in May every year.

Our students participate in various local and international poetry and short story competitions such as COBIS poetry, Gibraltar Cultural Services Spring short story competition, etc.

In addition, we organise and run Literacy Week every Spring and celebrate World Book Day by dressing up as our favourite authors or characters. We have had many author visits in the past few years; both local and UK-based poets and writers have run workshops or given talks at our school. Gibraltar Literature week runs in October-November every year, and we often attend some of the talks and workshops with our KS3 and KS4 students.

Frequent visits to the local libraries, both John Mackintosh and the Garrison Library, with our younger students are also an integral part of our extracurricular agenda. In addition to this, our English teachers run the school magazine where students write about their numerous achievements and trips themselves.


