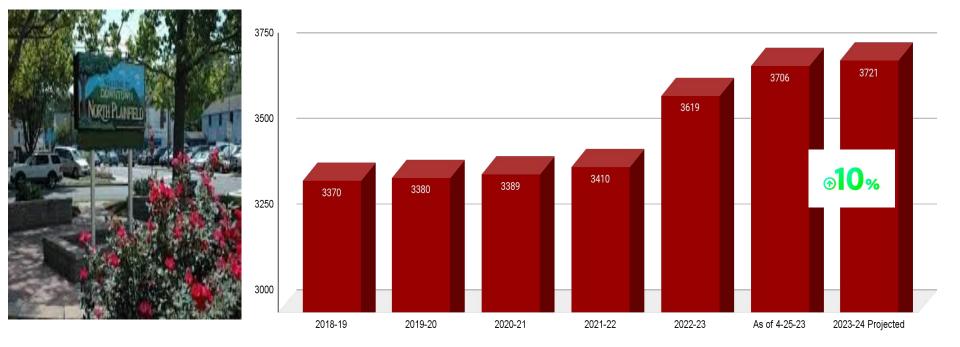
About Our Budget

- 2023-2024 Total Budget of \$93,510,366
 - 65% of Budget Relies on State Aid
 35% of Budget Relies on Local Tax Levy
- The general fund tax levy increase is 2% for the first time in 4 years.
- School tax levy payment is increased by \$629,115

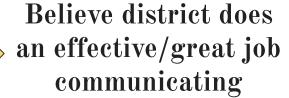




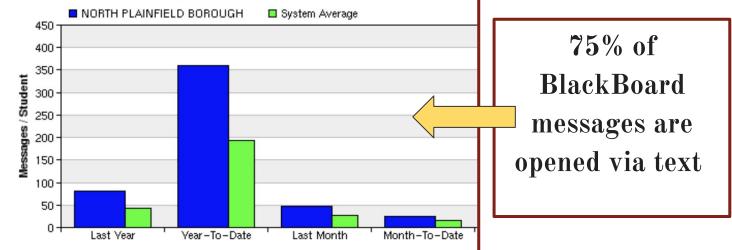


Satisfaction with Communication ROI 22-23
