



Medical Information



Varjak is an unusual cat, Mesopotamian Blue, an exotic and ancient breed descended from the legendary adventurer and hunter, Jalal. As Varjak listens to his grandfather recount the mesmerizing tales of Jalal. But when a malevolent Gentleman and his two vicious black cats arrive on the scene, Varjak's comfortable life is abruptly overturned. To save himself, his family, and his newfound friends, Varjak must master the long-forgotten Seven Skills in the Way of Jalal a sort of martial arts for cats.
