Happy February! We were busy in January, starting with the 2024 Inauguration and ending with a few exciting announcements about upcoming work. In addition to celebrating the Inauguration, we also celebrated Martin Luther King Jr. Day, the new McGlynn Playground groundbreaking, and more.

Here are just a few of our January highlights:

- We are partnering with Garbage to Garden to launch a free municipal curbside composting program this July! Residents can join the waitlist now at <u>MedfordComposts.com</u> and help us reach our climate goals.
- Our Facilities Management Department, with the Department and Office of Planning, Development, and Sustainability secured over \$117,000 from the U.S. Department of Energy to make the lighting system in City Hall more energy efficient, saving the City over \$22,000 per year.

This inclusive play space was funded by the Community Preservation Act, ARPA, CDBG and a state earmark secured by our state delegation of Christine Barber - State Representative, Sean Garballey, State Representative Paul Donato and Senator Pat Jehlen.

This project is scheduled to be complete by the beginning of the 2024/2025 school year! Thank you to the Assistant Superintendent Peter Cushing and Play advocate Chenine Peloquin for co-chairing the McGlynn Playground Committee, and to everyone who lent their time and expertise advocating for a more accessible, inclusive space for our children and families including but not limited to the two school committee members, Melanie McLaughlin and Jenny

Medford Secures Over \$117K in Grant Funding to Improve its Lighting Energy Efficiency at City Hall

Medford and Garbage to Garden Teaming Up to Bring Free Curbside Composting to Residents this Summer The Department of Facilities
Management, working with the
Department and Office of Planning,
Development, and Sustainability has
secured over \$117,000 in federal grant
funding to make the lighting system in
City Hall more energy efficient, Mayor
Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The grant, awarded by the U.S. Department of Energy will be used to replace old and outdated lighting fixtures throughout City Hall. This project is estimated to save the City over \$22,000 per year in maintenance and energy costs. These savings will offset the cost of the project in under six years.

Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn has announced the onboarding of three senior level hires. Veronica Shaw, the new Veterans' Services Director, started on January 2. Sal Di Stefano took over as Economic Development Director on January 15, and Scott Vandewalle will be the new Building Commissioner beginning on February 5.

All three bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to their new roles. Di Stefano has 19 years of municipal experience and served as the Economic Development Director for the City of Gloucester. Shaw is an Army veteran, small business-owner and previously worked in the Veterans Service Office in Wilmington. Vandewalle has served as Building Commissioner for the Town of Salisbury since 2014.

The City is partnering with Garbage to Garden to launch a free municipal curbside composting program, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Kohn announced. This collaboration aims to reduce waste, promote composting, and contribute to the city's commitment to creating a greener and more sustainable future.

Beginning July 1, 2024, this program will be free for eligible Medford residents that opt in to participate. Enrollment for this first year of the program is limited to 6,000 households. Residents can join the waitlist now at MedfordComposts.com. Residents who want to secure a spot in the free program and don't want to wait to start composting can begin curbside service immediately with Garbage to Garden at the City's preferred vendor rate of \$8.99/month.



municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.
