Part 1: Interest Statement

Please write a brief statement of no more than 150 words in which you explain why you want to take AP Art History and what you hope to get out of the course.

Part 2: Writing Sample

Please look over your writing from the year so far and identify a sample you think is representative of your best work. The sample should be at least three but no more than five pages in length. The sample may be a single essay that falls into this range, a selection from a longer work, or several shorter pieces submitted together. Do not worry about the class, the type of assignment, or the topic—just choose the writing that you feel shows your current abilities at their strongest.

Part 3: Writing Commentary

Please write a brief statement of no more than 150 words in which you explain why you have chosen the sample you picked in Part 2. If helpful, consider the questions below as you respond, but do not feel obligated to answer all of them or any particular one:

- How does this sample reflect your strengths and interests?
- What is it about this piece that stands out to you?
- What did you achieve in it that you are proud of?
- Did you face any particular challenges in planning, writing, or editing this sample? How did you overcome them?
- Is this writing much better than most of your other work this year, a little better, or roughly the same? Why do you think that is?
