### **CREDIT TRANSFERS**

- College programs have specific course requirements; courses outside of those requirements may not transfer.
- Credits may also transfer as electives, while being limited based on degree programs students pursue.
- Receiving colleges can confirm if a course will transfer toward your desired degree.

Meeting with a college advisor in high school means you can create a personalized education plan that can save you time and money by earning more purposeful course credits.

#### **OREGON PROMISE GRANT**

The Oregon Promise is a state grant that helps cover tuition at any Oregon community college.

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Attend an Oregon community college within 6 months of high school graduation.
- Submit FAFSA or ORSAA & apply for the Oregon Promise Grant by June 1.
- 2.0 Cumulative High School GPA or higher.
- 90 college credit maximum completed or attempted.
- Maintain at least half-time enrollment status (6 credit hours).
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

# **FINANCIAL AID**

To continue receiving federal financial aid, LBCC students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP):

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater AND
- Completing (passing) 70% of your attempted credits.
- \*Failing or withdrawing from too many courses can impact financial aid eligibility.
- \*Taking too many courses outside your ultimate degree plan can limit financial aid eligibility.
