
Reminders

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Welcome to Kindergarten at Chester Elementary School. We look forward to meeting you and your child. We hope that your experience at the Chester School is both positive and productive. This letter provides you with information regarding the kindergarten screening process for students entering kindergarten in September of 2024.

This year we will be using our online registration process. Please go to our website, grsd.org. There you will click on the General information tab. Here you will see a link to Student online registration. You will be able to complete the registration form, upload your child's birth certificate, any court ordered documents, and two proofs of residency. If you are unable to upload the necessary forms, you can mail them to the school or bring them with you to the screening on May 10th. The registration process and submittal of all forms is required by the state and will need to be completed prior to your child starting kindergarten.

Before entering school, a hard copy of the most current physical and immunization form must be submitted to our school nurse. These papers are required to enroll your child in kindergarten. If you have any medical related questions, our school nurse is Amanda Dean and she can be reached at 685-4235.

Please call Chester Elementary School by May 6th to schedule a screening appointment for your child on May 10th. Screenings generally take 30-60 minutes. If your child will not be attending in the fall, please call us so we can take your family off our mailing list. Our phone number is listed at the end of this letter. If your child is currently enrolled in our Preschool you will not need to register online. Please just call the office to set up a screening time.

We are excited to meet you and your child and look forward to working with your family. To schedule your child's kindergarten screening, please call Jen, our school secretary, at **413-685-1361**. January-February 2024 Chester Elementary School Update:

- We will complete our first round of before and after school Early Literacy Tutoring on February 14th. Our school is engaged in the Massachusetts Early Literacy Tutoring Program funded by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), which allows us to provide high quality early literacy tutoring, aligned to the science of reading, to our students in K-3 at no cost to us(Students engage in 40 minute sessions 3x/week before and after school). We plan to engage in a second 36 session cycle of Early Literacy Tutoring from March-June. *High dosage tutoring builds prerequisite and foundational skills to set students up for success with the current grade's core content. All costs for high-dosage tutoring are covered by the Department.
- DESE has just recently provided an additional opportunity for schools to partner with tutoring vendors for no-cost high dosage tutoring in grade 4 mathematics in order to accelerate student learning. We have partnered with Imagine Learning and will be providing evidence based, high quality targeted mathematics instruction to 8 students in grade 4 during their WIN(what I need) blocks beginning on February 5th. *High dosage tutoring builds prerequisite and foundational skills to set students up for success with the current grade's core content. All costs for high-dosage tutoring are covered by the Department.
- We are engaging in a free pilot program with Just Right Readers in order to accelerate student reading achievement through the use of personalized Science of Reading Take-Home decodable books. We will use student data to provide 3 rounds of "just right" phonics based, high quality readers to 24 of our students in grades K-2. Each student will receive a total of 30 books(3 rounds of 10 books). These Take-Home Decodable Packs extend phonics instruction into the home and engage parents and families in reading. Each book contains phonics tips and a qr code that provides direct and easy access to an engaging, short video lesson to help guide parents and students.
- After School Grade 5 Title 1 funded math tutoring began on 1/29/24. Students are receiving 70 minutes of instruction 2 days a week with Mrs. Provost(5th grade CES teacher) or Mr. Green(7th grade grsd math teacher).
- We started a Girls Who Code Club on January 11th after reading about the opportunity in the 12/18/23 edition of the Commissioner's Weekly Update. This club provides free computer science resources, including materials to start a <u>Girls Who Code Club</u> for students in grades 3-5. Students will learn the concepts of loops, variables, conditionals and functions that form the basis of all programming languages. We will receive a free \$300 Amazon Gift Card for forming this club at our school.
- On January 11th we expanded STEAM instruction to our students in preschool. Our STEAM teacher, Mrs. Nicholson is now working with our 3 and 4 year old students on Thursdays.
- We are successfully growing and harvesting cucumbers in our hydroponic garden! Students in third grade harvested and tasted our first batch of cucumbers on January 26th!
- We partnered with Blandford's Marsy Belle Farms to engage our students in kindergarten, grade 1, and grade 5 in a 2 part Microgreens Planting Project. During this enrichment experience, students planted and harvested pea and radish microgreens. Students finished harvesting their microgreens on February 1st.
- A crew from Pro-Playgrounds is scheduled to begin the playground installation process on 2/5/24!
- On February 15th, Kindergarten families will be invited in to watch their students perform skits tied to our ELA curriculum's knowledge building strand.
- On February 16th, fifth grade families will be invited to join us for a living history wax museum exhibit; students will present speeches tied to research projects.
- On February 16th, Betty, a certified service dog, will visit students in their classrooms at Chester.
- Two Chester Elementary School students received Massachusetts Student Achievement Awards for their exceptional performance on the 2022 MCAS test!
