## **Final District Audit Approved**

This month, the school board accepted and approved the school auditors report for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. The district ended the year with a negative balance of (\$1,007,406). Slightly better than the anticipated negative balance of the (\$1,200,000) that was projected at the final revised budget in 2023. This negative balance for the fiscal year was planned as the district used \$1,316,000 from the unreserved fund balance towards the construction project to update the facilities at the athletic complex. The district budget was just over \$300,000 to the good without the planned spending down from the unreserved fund towards the needed project. The spending down of the unreserved fund leaves the current balance around 8%, which is down from the recent 11% from last year's audit.

However, the spending has been planned by the board with the upgrades of the athletic complex. It is important to keep a healthy unreserved fund balance as it allows the board to have financial capabilities to make larger purchases as needed such as: vehicles, curriculum purchases, staffing adjustments, additional programs and offerings, facility upgrades, and larger maintenance items. The board has a set policy to maintain the unreserved fund balance between 5-7%.

### **School Board Sets Final Levy Amount**


The school board set the final levy amount at the December school board meeting. The levy was set at 6.05% overall when the final tax run was completed by MDE and Cass County. However, with the growth of the net tax capacity of the district, if the value of your property remained the same, your school taxes should have remained close to the same as the previous year. Although, the vast majority of people in the district did see an increase in the value of your property from the county assessor, which in turn would have increased the tax portion of your school taxes like the other areas. One other factor to keep in mind is that the Pillager School District is one of only 94 schools in the state that does not have a voter approved excess operating levy in place like the majority of schools across the state do. The voter approved excess level would increase revenue for the district.

#### **CTC Center Well Used**

The new CTC Center continues to be a facility that is used by our community. The facility has hosted several concerts from outside groups as well as concerts and musicals by our middle school and high school students. The CTC Center continues to be well used throughout the school day as well and a facility that continues to get great reviews when people see it and attend events.

### Have you ever been to the ocean? Where? What did you like about it?


Yes! My first "big" trip was this July to Coco Beach in Florida! I loved the ocean, shell picking at sunset was one of my favorite things to do.


## SPRING REGISTRATION



# The Husky Hangout

An "After School Targeted Services Academic Enrichment Program" through the Freshwater Education District is available to students in Grades 5-8.

The program is based on a minimum enrollment of 11 students.

**WHO:** THE HUSKY HANGOUT is available to any Pillager student in grades 5-8 who wishes to take advantage of after school academic support and enrichment activities during the school year.

WHAT: Each two-hour session consists of:

- 15 minutes Snack and Socialize Game/Trivia
- 1 Hour Homework Help

The Lead Teacher (Middle School Instructor) is available to help students complete homework assignments. If a student does not have assignments to complete they will receive supplemental math, reading, study skills instruction.


- 45 minutes Learning Activity





We invite parents and community members to be involved with Title I. If you would like to help review and write grants or be involved in the planning of Title I or Title IIA, please contact our Local Educational Agency (LEA) Mr. Josh Smith or our Title I teacher, Mrs. Wendy Hall.

We encourage parents to be involved in their child's education here at Pillager Elementary School. All students in Pillager Elementary are able to receive services under the School Wide Title I Plan. We use data from our testing to determine strengths and needs of our students.

We want all parents to be aware of the many opportunities to be on school committees. This includes a Title I committee. The Title I committee will annually review the "Ten Elements" of school-wide planning as they work on the Title I plan.

The district-wide Parental Involvement Policy procedures have been developed jointly with parents of children participating in Title I programs. The school will distribute this policy to all parents of students participating in Title I, Part A on or before September 20 of the present school year.

# ACCIE UPDATE

The focus this fall in the Career & Technical Education (CTE) department has been getting kids experiences and connections with industry, both in and out of the school building. For the agricultural education program, that has meant adding several field trips and other activities to what we already do.



In November, the Food Chemistry, Animal Science, and ProStart classes took a trip to the Redhead Creamery near Brooten, MN, for a tour of their dairy and cheesemaking facilities. Students got to see how the cows are cared for from birth to milking, and got to sample several of their cheeses.

Also in November, the Robotics class and 7th grade Ag Science/Robotics classes toured another dairy - this time Roerview Dairy Farm near Upsala - to learn about how robotics and automation are used to feed, milk, and clean up after dairy cattle.





Natural Resources class teamed up with Outdoor Activities to spend a few hours attempting a geocaching/orienteering navigation challenge in the school forest. Teams had to set a course using both GPS coordinates and compass navigation, then swapped courses with another team to see who could find the items of the scavenger hunt the fastest.

As much as we enjoy sharing what we've already done, we're also looking forward! The Arbor Day Plant Sale (4/26) will be here before you know it! Remember to drop off your pots, four packs, etc, in front of the greenhouse - we can always use them (please bag them up before leaving them). 




# COACHES OF THE MONTH

## Transportation Information

Parents, please call the bus garage by 7:00 a.m. if your child/children will not be riding the bus for the day. **This will help the buses stay on schedule!** 

**Special note:** Students are allowed only ONE designated bus stop in the morning and ONE designated bus stop in the afternoon. These stops must be registered through Fornshell Bus and Pillager School.

Transportation information forms are due in July.

No bussing is guaranteed without a completed bus form. Please send forms to Fornshell Bus Service or the Pillager School as soon as possible.

#### Bus Safety on the roads:

- Parents and district residents need to understand state laws in regards to school buses.
- When school is in session, buses will be stopping on all forms of roads: state highways, county roads, city streets and township roads. When buses stop, it means that a child is being picked up or dropped off. Red flashing lights mean that you must stop. It is illegal to pass a bus on either side while meeting or following the bus when the red lights are flashing.

### Bus Safety at school:

We also ask that you follow the bus safety in the area around the school building.

• The one way streets and driving restrictions have been developed for the safety of kids. The parking lot on the south side of the school is a one way parking lot. Please enter from the east end only and exit from the west end only. This helps the flow of traffic off of East Second St. as it is one way. Each student in kindergarten through grade ten receives bus safety training every year. All students take a written and practice test.

As adult drivers, please be good examples. Thank you for your help in making school a safer place for kids.

## **Emergency School Closings**

Emergency school closings, late starts, postponement or cancellation of events can be the result of severe weather conditions or mechanical failure of the school facilities. Please listen to the stations listed here for any time change in the school day. This is an emergency situation and we cannot afford to have the school telephone lines tied up.

If severe weather conditions develop overnight or are imminent early in the morning, the announcement to close school will be made sufficiently early in the morning so students need not prepare to meet the bus. If weather conditions gradually worsen during the school day the announcement to close school will be made approximately one hour before students are dismissed and transported. Under these conditions we would urge parents cooperation to insure that someone is there when their children arrive home. For parents who have teenagers who drive to school, we would encourage parents to ask these young drivers to leave school and proceed directly home, rather than risk more hazardous driving conditions by lingering around town.

If a severe blizzard sets in during the day and you are concerned for your children, you may come and get them from the principal's office. If conditions are too hazardous for bus operation, students will remain in school until weather conditions improve. We also want to remind parents that the possibility exists that students may be stranded in a school bus or car for a period of time and students should be dressed properly for severe winter weather to insure that they do not suffer from exposure.

In the event it is announced that school will be late, the "late start" will ALWAYS be a two-hour late start" and school will start at 10:30 a.m. Whenever school is delayed with a "late start", there will not be a breakfast program.

When school is closed because of severe weather, all school events and activities, including Early Childhood and Community Education programs will also be postponed as well as all practice for these events. The one exception to this is varsity athletic practice which may be held. Rural varsity athletes are reminded, however, that they must have a "snow home" if they remain for practice under these conditions.

In the event of a school closing or cancellation, a phone and email message will go to all primary contact phone numbers and emails for all students through our JMC Alert System.
