

Criminal Justice

Students in the BVROP Criminal Justice course at Claremont High School (CHS) finished another successful year as they explored various careers within the criminal justice system. The course prepares students who want to one day work as police officers, lawyers, investigators, and other professionals within the field. Course instruction includes lessons on the Constitution, various classifications of different crimes such as crimes against people or property and legal trials.

Students also hone their analytical skills through daily warm-up exercises centered around hypothetical crime scenes. The warm-ups require students to think like investigators as they make determinations of innocence or fault based on clues and information provided.

CHS sophomore, Justin Duran, enjoys the exercises and wants to eventually work as an investigator.

"We get to work as detectives in this class. Everyone works together and it's very engaging. This course helps me broaden my understanding of detective work," he said.

CHS sophomore Adyson Wilson, who wants to be a lawyer, shared her appreciation for the course.

"This class opened my eyes to law enforcement. The warm-ups help us uncover details and put them in order to find out what happened. We get to think critically and look past the surface."

Criminal Justice courses begin again this fall at Claremont High School as well as Chino High School, Hillside High School, San Antonio High School, and Upland High School.








Incoming LVN students will learn basic concepts in pharmacology, nutrition, psychology, anatomy, physiology, medical-surgical nursing, care of mother and her newborn, normal growth and development, and concepts of leadership for healthcare in classroom and clinical settings. The program includes the fundamentals of medical terminology, sequential skills building in basic arithmetic skills, math for medications, and medications, and medical abbreviations are presented. Integrated throughout the program are academic and CTE standards, which include safety, communication, technology, ethics, career planning, and other employment skills.

The first step in the enrollment process is to schedule the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) exam! TABE is designed to assess the skills and knowledge of adult learners in applied math, mathematic computation, reading, and language. Candidates can take the TABE exam FREE of charge! Candidates can call the Career Training Center at 909-947-3400 to schedule their exam.

To begin the application process for the program, students must complete the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) Exam. TABE testing is currently taking place at the Baldy View ROP Career Training Center: 1501 S. Bon View Avenue Ontario, CA 91761.



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Adult students who sign up for the Supply Chain Fundamentals class will be exposed to industry professionals throughout the course. Adults students will have the opportunity to become OSHA certified, Forklift certified, and Yellow Belt certified in Six Sigma.

Students will learn basic fundamentals from receiving inventory to shipping products. Students will learn how to use programs within the supply chain. Students will be introduced to problems solving skills that can be applied to career pathways within logistics!




