



# CERT, CSI, & Crime Scene Photography

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) courses taught by Instructors Scott Snedeker and Terry Henson again collaborated to convene an emergency response drill during the final week of summer courses at the Career Training Center. This year, the drill also included Instructor Derrick Williams' Crime Scene Photography course. A student portrayed an active shooter who was ultimately apprehended and questioned by the police, played by students in CSI. Crime Scene Photography students took pictures of the scene and worked with law enforcement to document what took place.

Students from the various involved courses acted as victims awaiting help from the CERT students. CERT students were responsible for setting up three triage areas corresponding to different levels of medical attention required. They utilized stretchers to transport students to help and safety. The medical procedures the CERT students acted out was the culmination of all their training throughout their summer course. The course curriculum also gave the students the opportunity to earn CPR certification.

Cole Schaefer and AMR Ambulances generously volunteered to receive students in stretchers and drove them through the campus to Instructor Henson's classroom, which served as a clinic for the purpose of the drill. Additional volunteers from the LAPD and Claremont PD's CERT team participated in uniform with official police vehicles to add to the realism of the event.

Rancho Cucamonga sophomore, Clarissa Do, shared her take on the drill and her experience with the CERT course. "I'm acting as the Incident Commander today so I have to keep checking in on everyone on the CERT team to make sure they're where they need to be and are doing their jobs," she said. "It's a really fun environment because we're doing things we'd never normally do in another class. This course is challenging because it's fast-paced and we have to learn as we go, but we also learn things you could only dream of learning at such a young age."

Clarissa shared that she is interested in medicine and one day wants to become a plastic surgeon. She is already enrolled in the Baldy View ROP Medical Assistant course this fall.

Crime Scene Photography student Laurie Milam, a junior from Buena Vista High School, shared, "This has been one of my favorite courses of all time. We learned all about shooting cameras on manual settings, like how to adjust F-Stops, shutter speed, and how to focus the camera," she said, adding that her favorite activity of all was the emergency drill.

Ontario High School Junior, Jose Meraz, took CSI and was one of the investigators.

"As an investigator I had to look around for evidence, question witnesses, and talk to the suspect. I also had to help determine if there were other reasonable suspects for the crime. It's been a fun day!" he said.

As Baldy View ROP continues to develop curriculum for its Logistics pathway coming to Claremont High School (CHS) and the Career Training Center in Fall 2019, we are busy touring local logistics and shipping companies to ensure our exciting new courses are aligned with current industry standards. On Wednesday, July 19, BVROP staff toured Eagle Marine Services (EMS), South Port of Los Angeles, and United Parcel Service (UPS) in Ontario with CHS students and CHS Principal Dr. Brett O'Connor to learn more about how two of the region's largest logistics and distribution companies operate. CHS students in attendance were unfamiliar with how these companies generally operate, but the tour gave them insight to this regionally thriving industry and piqued their interest to its possibilities. Students shared their thoughts by taking interest surveys after each tour.

"There are various jobs available for all different skill levels. EMS was very organized and had a process to make sure all work ran smoothly," a student said in their interest survey regarding the EMS tour.

Regarding UPS, one student said, "What interested me most were the machines and the thought that was put into them and the organization regarding how everything has to be processed." MAX.

Terazia Frierson's line of work in stage technology has sent her around the world. She is currently working in and exploring Europe through her job with Celebrity Cruises. An Upland High School grad, Terazia worked in her school's Highlander Auditorium as a high school student when she took four semesters of the Baldy View ROP Stage Technology course over her junior and senior years. Initially enrolling out of an interest in the entertainment industry and a curiosity to learn more, Terezia gained lessons in ROP she never saw coming.

"ROP really exposed me to a whole world that I didn't know existed. I became significantly more involved in school and the community. I got a part-time job working for the school auditorium, which gave me something to put on my resume. I had experiences to talk about for my college application essays. I'm also still friends with some of the people I

worked with while enrolled in my ROP classes," Terazia said.

Terazia continued in the industry she discovered in ROP by attending the University of Nevada Las Vegas and majoring in Entertainment Engineering. After graduating college, Terezia began her career through an internship with Cirque du Soleil.

Today, Terezia is part of an entertainment staff for Celebrity Cruises that is comprised of people from over 60 countries. So far, she has travelled to over 15 countries working for the cruise line.

"I get to do what I love while travelling the world," she said. "I work directly with a small team of 12 people who run the behind-the-scenes elements of entertainment onboard a cruise ship. In my role, I operate and maintain live performances in theatre spaces, assist with running shows, set up light fixtures, operate automation equipment, and help with performer quick changes."

While the location may be a world apart, Terazia shared that the duties of her job are not that different from what she did in high school as an ROP student working in the Highlander Auditorium.

"My ROP courses in Stage Technology taught me the fundamentals of the industry that I use every day. I work with identical equipment and use the same international stage lingo to communicate with my coworkers," she said.

Terazia added that there are skills beyond the technical aspects of her job that ROP prepared her to succeed in as well.

"I also learned the human elements of my job in ROP. We developed an awareness of working safely, how to clearly communicate, how to be organized and think ahead, and also how to solve problems. If I decided to go in a different career direction, I still would be able to take these lessons with me. Oh, and we also learned not just to be on time, but early for work shifts."


