

Baldy View Regional Occupational Program's 1983 Grumman Fire Truck paint finish had seen better days. Placed outdoors on the Baldy View ROP campus, the truck's paint finish was faded and weathered. "Administration and staff had been wanting to refurbish the truck as it is the centerpiece of our Fire Technology Class," said Steve Hall,

Retired Montclair Fire Department Engineer and Fire Technology Lead Instructor.

The truck was sent to TOP GUN Paint and Body located at 450 South Wineville in Ontario. TOP GUN Owners, Richard and Lisa Ramos generously discounted their labor and contacted Manager, Janet Padilla and Sales Representative, Nick Dunikoski of Sherwin-Williams Paint Store located at 633 W. State Street in Ontario. Sherwin-Williams generously donated paint and materials towards the project.

By mid-December 2020, the truck, with its new classic Fire Engine Red finish was back on campus, ready for the upcoming Fire Technology students. Beth Stelzer, a Junior from Claremont High School is currently enrolled in Stage Technology. The course takes students behind the scenes to explore stage production. Students learn how to build sets and run a production. During distance learning, students have focused on roles of theatre crews. Beth enrolled in the course to expand her knowledge of high school and professional theatre productions. Beth explains, "BVROP taught me how to work in teams without constant supervision in a real working environment." Beth shared that Stage Technology taught her the power of team work. Senior Joshua Perez from Chino Hills High School is currently enrolled in the Event Planning Class. The course teaches students the event industry from concept through event dates. Students learn to create budgets, event lists, vendor management, and more. Mrs. Rodgers explains, "I have used the current pandemic to teach my students how to pivot in challenging situations because pivoting comes with the territory of becoming a successful event planner. During virtual learning students create mood boards via Canva and learn new trends in the Industry due to Covid-19 such as Micro Events." The course provides simulations where students are directed to create and host events as a project. Joshua shares, "The most valued concept that we've learned thus far is managing budgets and how to mitigate the obstacles that come with running a self-made business. ROP is important to students since this program offers courses that cater to students' passions and future plans after high school. ROP is an amazing opportunity for students to explore different occupations which can ultimately help them decide on a future career." After high school, Joshua plans to study to become a clinical psychologist. Thank you to Instructor Mrs. Rodgers for sharing this story!








CONNECT WITH US!
