Practice counting in the car, point out words, shapes, letters when you are out and about.


Folders go home Thursday so you can start working on our words for the following week. Please send them back in the following Monday empty. Please make sure you read through any school flyers or reminders.

Letters, Sounds, Sight Words, and Numbers

Click link for - Weekly letters and words of the week

- We learn 2 letters a week after the first few weeks of school. We learn how to recognize their name, sound, how to write them and what words begin with them. We end the week before winter break with a letter fashion show.
- We begin with 2 words a week and then move to 3 later in the year. We write them in sentences, spell them and sing songs with them.
- We practice recognizing numbers, counting 100 and writing numbers to 100.
- Penmanship and proper printing is so important - top to bottom, left to right, forming a circle counter clockwise. Through proper practice good habits are formed.

Kindergarten Tips



- Please be on time to school and when picking your child up.
- Feed your child a healthy breakfast and pack them a healthy snack.
- Please make sure they get plenty of rest. Bedtime between 7:30 and 8:30 is ideal.
- Please assist your child but try not to give answers or prompt them. He/she will need help with the technology, especially at first. Please practice navigating through the screens to get them familiar with how they work.
- They need to learn and make mistakes for themselves.
- Please give them more responsibilities and independence. Work up to using 3-4 step directions.
- Give them small tasks and keep building to increase perseverance skills.
- Please limit computer, I-pad, and phone screen time when your child has free time.
- Please try to spend lots of time outside, doing hands-on activities and spending time as a family or playing games.

Writing We use phonetic spelling in everything we do. We do spell the sight words we have learned correctly. Every other word we sound out or stretch the word to hear the sound and write them down. For example - the word purse would be phonetically spelled prs for now.

How to read a book with your child

- Picture walk; have your child look through the book and tell you about the pictures.
- Read the title to them and have them predict what it will be about.
- Go though and look for sight words.
- Read to your child, using expression and voices!!
- Have them read to you.
- Re-read the story and ask questions about: characters, setting, plots, beginning, middle and end



Where Can | Find a Book to Read?

The goal is to read <u>at least</u> 10 minutes per day.

This can be broken up in a way that works for your child. The timer below is for 5 minutes, so consider doing two 5 minute sessions. Remember the different ways to have your child read
