




For most of you the next stop is here....

In order to have a successful experience at MHS, or any other High School, you need to do a little planning.

Planning is good.

Also, 8th graders are required by the State of Idaho to do a 4 Year Plan.



Because it is a good idea to plan.

What a Four Year Plan is NOT:

- It is **not** your High School Registration, you will do that in May
- It is **not** a permanent, "carved in stone", unchangeable document.
- Not your High School Registration
- Not your High School Registration
- Not your High School Registration



What a Four Year Plan is:

A four-year plan allows you, the student, to:

- Personalize your high school experience
- Incorporate classes that will lead to your future college major and career
- Make the most of Advanced Opportunities
- Ensure that you graduate from high school on time.



In order to get credit for a class, you MUST receive a passing grade (D/60%) in the course!

Credit Recovery includes repeating courses, summer school, online courses, etc.

Freshman year is KEY:

Students who earn at least 5 credits and get no more than 1 F their 1st semester are 3.5 times more likely to graduate than those with more than 1 F.

Will I Graduate?

FRESHMAN YEAR:

- One Semester F decreases the likelihood of graduating from 83% to 60%
- Two Semester Fs decreases the likelihood to 44%
- Three Semester Fs = 31% chance of graduating

Students must enter prepared to succeed

Students who elect the honors course should expect an accelerated reading and writing program. Challenging texts, novels, poems, biographies, and research will serve as springboards for narrative and expository writing, group and individual assignments, independent reading, integration of technology, research, creative interpretation, and presentations, either oral, electronic, or artistic. Standards are high, and students will be expected to strive for excellence, growth, and academic integrity. And yes, a summer reading assignment.

- 3. Teacher Evaluation Form.
- 4. Graded Piece of Writing from 8th Grade ELA Class with Form.

Am I eligible for Honors English 9?

Students are eligible to apply for Honors English if they meet the following criteria:

- 1. Students must earn a "B" (83%) or above to advance to English 9 Honors.
- 2. Are motivated to work hard consistently in reading and writing.
- 3. Enjoy being challenged beyond the expectations of an average student.
- 4. Are able to handle a vigorous and extensive workload.

Social Studies / History

- Required classes already filled
- Freshman: World History 1 semester only (or Honors World History by application)
- Sophomore: US History 1 (or Pre Advanced Placement)
- Junior: US History 2 (or Advanced Placement)
- Senior: Government
- Additional classes may be taken as electives

Foreign Language

- Not required, but highly recommended
- Choose Spanish or American Sign Language
- 2 years (consecutive) required for many colleges

P.E. Classes

- 2 credits required, may be taken any year
- Boys Beginning Strength, Girls Beginning Strength, 9th Grade PE, Walking Fitness are the beginning PE courses
- If currently in 8th grade Advanced PE, can go directly to Adv Strength upon approval from Mr. Kiser.
- 0 Hour Weights (Advanced Strength)
- Additional PE classes may be taken as an elective (Boys/Girls Lifetime Fitness, Walking Fitness)
- Advanced Strength Training suggested/required for Athletes every year
- Marching Band and FX Choir count as a P.E. class



22-23 MHS Art Dept. Classes




ART 1 (9-12)

Art 1 is an intro to art course with no prerequisites, you can take it for 1 or both semesters & receive credit. You must take Art 1 before taking many of the other art classes.

In Art 1, we do multiple projects in different media so students can try a lot of different things like drawing, acrylic, watercolors, and ceramics.







ART 2 (10-12)

Freshmen can skip Art 1 with a recommendation from Ms. Johnson!

Semester 1 is Traditional Art 2; Semester 2 is Contemporary Art 2; you can take one or both. S1 focuses more on art history and traditional drawing and painting. S2 focuses more on current art methods and jobs like illustration and graphic design.



CERAMICS (10-12)

Ceramics is a yearlong class focused mainly in clay with handbuilding and wheel throwing.

You must take Art 1 first, so if you're interested in Ceramics, take Art 1 as a Freshman so you can join Ceramics for your Sophomore year!









CRAFT (9-12)

Semester 1 class with no prerequisites, but strong interest is helpful! We typically do projects with sewing, crochet/ knitting/ macrame, resin jewelry, string art, clay, painting, plus more!



EXPERIMENTAL MEDIA (9-12)

Semester 2 course with no prerequisites. THIS IS NOT A COMPUTER CLASS, this is an art class focused on creativity and the process of making art. Projects usually include handmade book journals, handmade tools, mark making, paint pouring, non-traditional art materials, etc. It can be messy!









Adv. Art- Juniors & Seniors Only!

This is just to show you that you can continue taking art classes through all 4 years of your high school career! Adv. Art is available after Art 1 & Art 2 or Ceramics. It is for serious artists looking to build their portfolio!









Yearbook is available to incoming freshmen with a minimum of a B in ELA, interest in photo & design, and an application!

Yearbook is a yearlong class that requires students to go to athletic and other events outside of school time.

There is also a required workshop over the summer.






