The Importance of School Attendance

Regular school attendance is one of the most powerful ways you can prepare your child for success, both in school and in life. When you make school attendance a priority, you are teaching them the lifetime habit of responsibility. It's important for parents to model the value of education, including the importance of regular attendance. Students with low absentee rates are shown to have higher academic achievement, better grades and enjoy school more. On the other hand, students with high absenteeism rates often fall behind. This can lead to lower grades in school and ultimately higher dropout rates. Elementary students who miss an average of just two school days per month often have difficulty keeping up with their peers academically and tend to fall behind.

Some ways that parents can help make school attendance a priority:

- * Schedule doctor and dental appointments so they interfere as little as possible with the school day.
- * Communicate the importance of good attendance to your student.
- * Arrange vacations during school holidays.
- * Teach your child how to set and use an alarm clock.
- * Keep the television turned off in the morning.
- Plan ahead. Encourage your child to prepare for the next school day by laying out clothes the night before and helping to fix lunches
- * Take an interest in school work and be involved as much as possible in your child's learning.
- * Establish a routine for bedtime as well as the morning.

Regular school attendance patterns encourage the development of other responsible patterns of behavior and habits they will carry through life.
