

PUSD Elementary and Middle School Biliteracy Award Community Service Project Ideas

Community service hours should be completed in the DLIP program target language where applicable.

All activities should be completed with proper adult supervision and teacher permission where applicable.

- Make thank you cards, holiday cards, birthday cards, or notes to thank or honor people in your community or to brighten someone's day.
- Write a letter to your elected official about a cause you believe in.
- Help at a school or in a community event such as as school beautification day, community event, festival, parade, etc.
- Read stories to or share your talent with younger children who need help learning how to read or to a senior citizen who might benefit from companionship.
- Organize a game or club activity.
- Share a hobby, collection, or talent with a local girl or boy scout group, library group, or class.
- Make a "New Student" guide for 4th or 5th graders that includes your favorite books or reading materials, activities, and other helpful tips.
- Write letters to service men/women.
- Go through the books you've grown out of and donate them to a teacher, class, or office waiting room. Include a review of one or more of the books to tell readers what the book is about and what you enjoyed about it.
- Record an audiobook of one of your favorite books to contribute to a classroom listening center.
- Establish a pen pal project with children in another country and share what you are learning about life in that country with a classmate.
- Create a game or activity for other students or siblings to help them learn the target language.
