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SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL MINUTES

Tuesday, December 7, 2021 at 3:30 p.m. at San Pasqual Union School

Meeting called to order at 3:35pm.

Members Graves, J Hansen, Legge-Beekman, Higgins, Bronson, McKay, Read-Smith, Burroughs, and P Hansen present. Members Dussia, Mokhtari, Carroll not present.

Guests welcomed and the pledge of allegiance recited.

Hearing of the public. No comments shared.

Member Legge-Beekman motioned to approve agenda and minutes. Member Bronson seconded the motion.

Principal Burroughs provided an COVID-19 Update. ([see district website for presentation](#)).

Principal Burroughs provided an overview of the Educator Effectiveness Block Grant. The Grant is for \$130,000 and the District is looking at a plan to spend the money including the following possibilities: Teacher improvements for evaluation system including peer colorbation, EL support, Instructional aide training, and math tutoring similar to “everyone a reader”. Mr. Burroughs will keep SSC apprised of new developments.

Principal Burroughs provided information on the School Accountability Report Card (SARC). Currently the state is behind with the information needed to populate the template in which it provides approximately 75% of the information. The state has not moved the approval date of Feb 1, 2022 but once it is fully populated it will be brought back to SSC.

Principal Burroughs provided the Principal Report in which he shared the following:

- 1st Interim projects declining enrollment which will affect the District budget if no further adjustments to funding formulas are made by the state.
- After an inspection of the playground equipment, expect repairs or replacement of equipment as recommended.
- The majority of the HVAC units will be replaced over the break.

- Currently there are no plans to add any shade to the lower playground but the District is aware of the need.
- The District calendar is approved for the [2022-2023](#) school year.
- We received the census information and are currently reviewing the impact of the proposed trustee area maps. More information will be shared at the February Board meeting.

During Team Input/Discussion, members expressed concerns on the following items:

- Projected budget deficit
- Safety during middle school sports games during the school day.

Dress Code: The [current dress code](#) and [dress code referral form](#). As you will notice, the referral form references our progressive discipline policy, which includes parental notifications.

Internet Safety: We received suggestions to consider the Bark for Schools and Protect Young Eyes programs. We consulted with Geoff Horn, our "tech guy", who advised that Bark for Schools was shared with parents about a year ago. He did not see a need for it at school as we currently receive content filtering and management through the San Diego County Office of Education. He also researched the [Protect Young Eyes](#) program. Similar to Bark, he believes our content filtering at school to be sufficient. He noted that it could be a helpful resource to share with parents for home use. However, he feels that a smart wifi router with parental controls in the home to be the most powerful and important tool for parents to utilize. In his opinion, additional programs like Protect Young Eyes would be a supplement to that. He noted that Protect Young Eyes recommends the Gryphon Wifi router (gryphonconnect.com) which is what he uses in his home. He also noted that Protect Young Eyes provides similar content review services to what we receive through Common Sense Media. He would encourage parents to use both Common Sense Media and imdb.com to review the appropriateness of various media.

Anti-Bullying/Cyberbullying

To date, we have been unsuccessful in getting our school resource officer out to campus to

promote anti-bullying. In the meantime, the Foundation is researching possible programs to fund.
