SUBJECT: SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER VACANCY

Electronically submitted letters of interest are acceptable. Please observe the indicated deadline for submission of letters of interest.

Individuals interested in the following positions should submit a letter of application to the Human Resources Office. The position will remain open until filled.

INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT DISTRICT EMPLOYEES SHOULD SUBMIT AN ENTIRE APPLICATION PACKET, including: letter of interest, resume; credentials; three [3] external references; Act 34, 151 and 114 clearance forms; and Act 126 mandatory child abuse training. Additional documents will be required if offered employment. Clearances need to be within five [5] years, and no more than one [1] year old if employment is offered. Other documents, including a health physical form and TB test results, will be required if offered employment.

SCHOOL POLICE OFFICER – Temporary, full-time position available immediately with an opportunity for regular, part-time work thereafter for an armed school police officer. Starting rate is \$25.00 per hour.

Requirements:

- Successful completion of basic training as required by the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch D (relating to municipal police education and training) or have graduated from the Pennsylvania State Police Academy
- Previous employment as a municipal police officer or state trooper with the Pennsylvania State Police, and separated from that service in good standing
- Successful completion of (or ability to attend and successfully complete) the Basic School Resource Officer Course of Instruction offered by the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO)
- Obtain and maintain (or ability to obtain and maintain) a School Police Officer designation from the Court of Common Pleas
- Maintain job operations in compliance with guidelines and regulations determined by the administration, Board of Directors, state, and federal agencies
