## Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. The family must be a resident of the Francis Howell School District.
- 2. The student must first be enrolled in a Francis Howell school (Under Missouri House Bill 1552, depending on the virtual provider and the number of classes chosen, the student may have to transfer to the district that hosts that virtual provider).
- 3. Student must have parent/guardian approval if under 18 years of age.

## **Application Procedure:**

- 1. Student or student's parent/guardian make a request for online education.
- 2. Student and student's parent/guardian discuss online education with the school counselor or principal. In-person instruction must be discussed and considered before families apply for virtual school.
- 3. Student and student's parent/guardian are made aware of mandated participation in state assessments, completion of ICAP, and online education expectations.
- 4. Student, student's parent/guardian, and counselor complete Sections A, B (if applicable) and C.
- 5. ICAP (Four year plan) is completed with high school student and counselor.

- Students enrolling in Government must attend school to complete the Missouri and US Constitution assessments.
- Students enrolling in high school Health must attend school to participate in hands-on CPR training or be able to present a certificate demonstrating CPR proficiency.
- Students dropping an online course after 10 days will earn an F in the course.
- The District may deny or terminate a student's participation in virtual instruction if it can be demonstrated that virtual instruction is not in the best interest of the student.
- Current virtual students who wish to continue must re-enroll in virtual instruction every year. An application approved for the 1<sup>st</sup> semester will carry over into the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.

## **REQUIRED:**
