WHY COMMUNITY COLLEGE?

Excellent Faculty



- Instructors with Masters, Doctorates, and licensed professionals
- NO Teaching Assistants teaching classes

Small Class Sizes



- Average class size is 30 40 students at a community college (compared to 100 - 300 at a UC)
- More opportunity to interact with professors and students in the classroom setting

Second Chance



- Can try again for the dream university that was just out of reach the first time
- GPA starts over for college coursework
- Partnerships between community colleges and universities (TAG, ADT, Honors, etc.)

Equitable Access for All

Affordable



- \$46 per unit for a CA resident
 - Approx. \$1,340 for one year of tuition and fees at OCC
 - Approx. \$7,074 for one year of full-time tuition and fees at CSUF
 - Approx. \$17,205 for one year of full-time tuition and fees at UCI
- CA Promise = many community college students attend TUTION-FREE!!!

Pirates Promise

A **tuition assistance program** is a statewide initiative designed to make higher education accessible and affordable to the community providing financial assistance to first time college students.

- Pirates Promise covers the enrollment fee (\$46 per unit) solely at OCC
- Textbook assistance on eligibility and availability.





- A score of 4-5 on the AP Macroeconomics exam is equivalent to Econ 2 (if taken before spring 2021) and can be used in place of the macroeconomics course.
- pre of 5 on the AP Macroeconomics exam is equivalent to Econ 2 (if taken after spring 2021) and can be used in place of the macroeconomics course
- A score of 5 on the AP Calculus AB exam or 4 on the BC exam is equivalent to Math 31A and can be used in place of the first calculus course.
- A score of 5 on the AP BC Calculus exam is equivalent to Math 31AB and can be used in place of both calculus courses

COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAMS

UC Transfer Admission's Guarantee (TAG)

- 6 of the 9 undergraduate UCs participate in TAG. (UCLA, UCB, and UCSD do not)
- Students must meet specific requirements (GPA/coursework) to reserve a seat in ONE major on LILE UC compus a year in advance.
- On some campuses, certain majors are excluded.

CSU Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)

- OCC currently offers 28 different ADT's.
- An ADT guarantees an eligible student:
 - a seat in the CSU system (not at a specific school) for a matching major;
 - priority admission consideration; and
 - no more than 60 units to finish the BA/BS degree post-transfer
- You can consult the CSU ADT Major & Campus Search webpage for a comprehensive list of matching majors between OCC and CSU campuses.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO TRANSFER?


- For many majors, two-year transfer is <u>possible</u> for students who attend full time, stick to one major, and earn the necessary GPA.
- Some majors (particularly STEM majors) often require longer.
- Important considerations include:
 - Desired major and school(s)
 - Incoming math placement
 - AP and IB exam credit
 - Units completed each semester
 - Participation in Summer and Intersession terms
 - Whether or not student changes major

- ENROLL IN CLASSES BEFORE THEY FILL-UP; SPECIALLY IN ENGLISH, MATH, SCIENCES AND POPULAR PROGRAMS AT OCC
- MORE CHOICES AVAILABLE REGARDING DATES, TIMES, CLASS SIZE AND INSTRUCTORS

Participate in Orange Coast College's fall 2023 priority registration by completing the following steps by the end of April 2023:

- 1. Submit an OCC, GWC or Coastline application
- 2. Meet with an OCC counselor to create a Student Education Plan (SEP)

Remember that it is NOT a requirement to meet with a counselor in order to register for classes.
