DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTION

- The modification of the curriculum to meet the unique needs of all learners. This is “responsive” teaching, when teachers plan for lessons with student variance in mind.
- Educational practices such as authentic assessment, project-based learning, and thematic interdisciplinary instruction can facilitate differentiated instruction for gifted students.
- Differentiated instruction provides multiple paths for success for all students, and is designed to challenge gifted students in the classroom.



INSTRUCCIÓN DIFERENCIADA

- La modificación del plan de estudios para satisfacer las necesidades únicas de todos los estudiantes. Esta es una enseñanza “receptiva”, en la que los maestros planean lecciones con la variedad de estudiantes en mente.
- Las prácticas educativas como la evaluación auténtica, el aprendizaje basado en proyectos y la instrucción interdisciplinaria temática pueden facilitar la instrucción diferenciada para los estudiantes superdotados.
- La instrucción diferenciada proporciona múltiples caminos para el éxito para todos los estudiantes, y está diseñada para desafiar a los estudiantes superdotados en el aula.





CLUSTER GROUPING

- **What is a cluster model?**
4th-6th grade students identified as gifted are grouped in clusters within the general education classroom.
- **Our Goal**
Students are placed in classrooms with teachers who have earned or are working to earn their GATE certificate.
- GATE training prepares teachers with the knowledge and skills essential to meeting the academic and social-emotional needs of gifted learners.





AGRUPACIÓN SEGÚN HABILIDADES

- **¿Qué es un modelo de agrupación según habilidades?**

Los estudiantes de los grados 4 y 6 identificados como superdotados se agrupan en grupos dentro del aula de educación general.



- **Nuestra meta**

Los estudiantes son colocados en aulas con maestros que han obtenido o están trabajando para obtener su certificado de GATE.



- La capacitación GATE prepara a los maestros con los conocimientos y habilidades esenciales para satisfacer las necesidades académicas y socioemocionales de los estudiantes superdotados



IDENTIFICATION ★ PROCESS ★



Teachers observe, collect data, and complete forms on students who demonstrate gifted characteristics.



ALL 3rd grade students (and eligible 4th-6th graders) will take the NNAT3 in January, a non-verbal test that assesses cognitive abilities.



Results of the NNAT3 and student eligibility for the GATE program are sent to schools and parents in May. Sites will then hold parent information meetings to explain more about the program.

PROCESO DE IDENTIFICACIÓN★



Los maestros observan, recopilan datos y completan formularios sobre los estudiantes que demuestran características de un estudiante superdotado.



TODOS LOS estudiantes de tercer grado (y los estudiantes elegibles de cuarto y sexto) tomarán la NNAT3 en enero, una prueba no verbal que evalúa las habilidades cognitivas.



Los resultados de la NNAT3 y la elegibilidad de los estudiantes para el programa GATE se envían a las escuelas y a los padres en mayo. Luego, los planteles escolares realizarán reuniones de información para padres para explicar más sobre el programa.



NAGLIERI Non-Verbal Ability Test NNAT3

- 30-minute, non-verbal test on the computer, that measures a student's general ability without using language or prerequisite knowledge.
- Assesses a child's problem-solving and visual-spatial reasoning abilities (instead of material learned in school), with questions that incorporate abstract shapes and designs.
- Considered unbiased scoring regardless of each student's primary language, socioeconomic status, educational history or color/vision impairment.





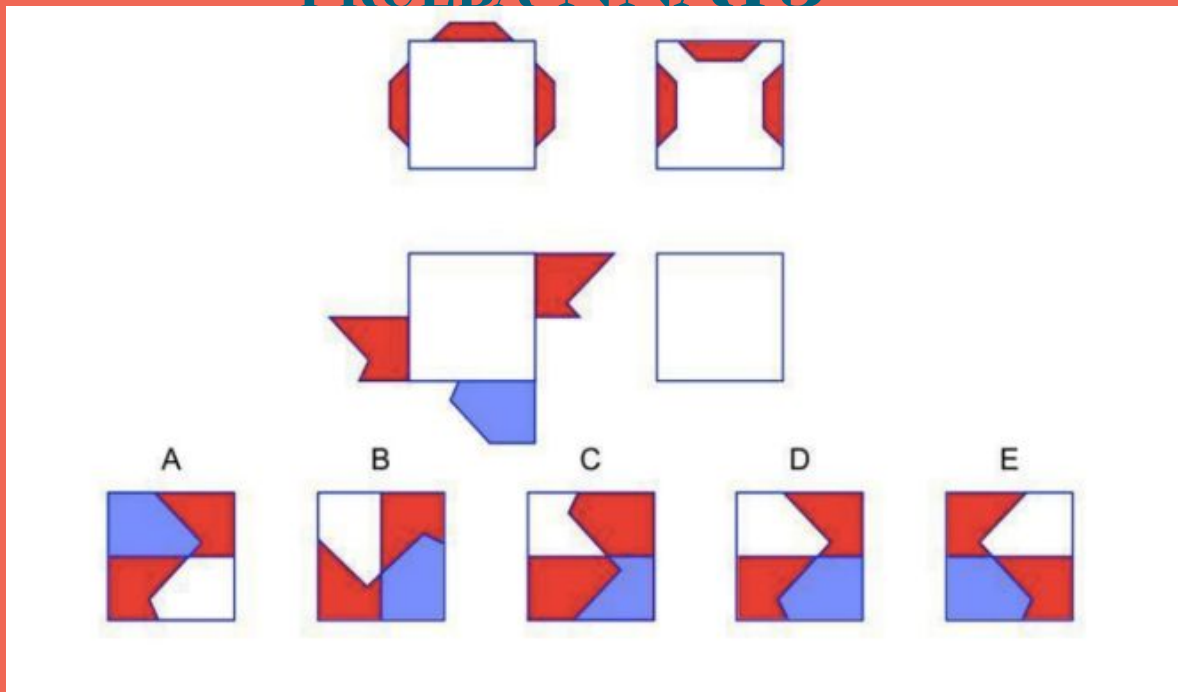
PRUEBA NAGLIERI DE HABILIDADES NO VERBALES NNAT3

- ❑ Prueba no verbal de 30 minutos en la computadora, que mide la capacidad general de un estudiante sin usar el lenguaje o el conocimiento de los requisitos previos.
- ❑ Evalúa las habilidades de resolución de problemas y el razonamiento visual-espacial de un niño (en lugar de material aprendido en la escuela), con preguntas que incorporan formas y diseños abstractos.
- ❑ Se considera puntaje imparcial independientemente del idioma natal de cada estudiante, el estado socioeconómico, la historia educativa o la discapacidad de color/vista.

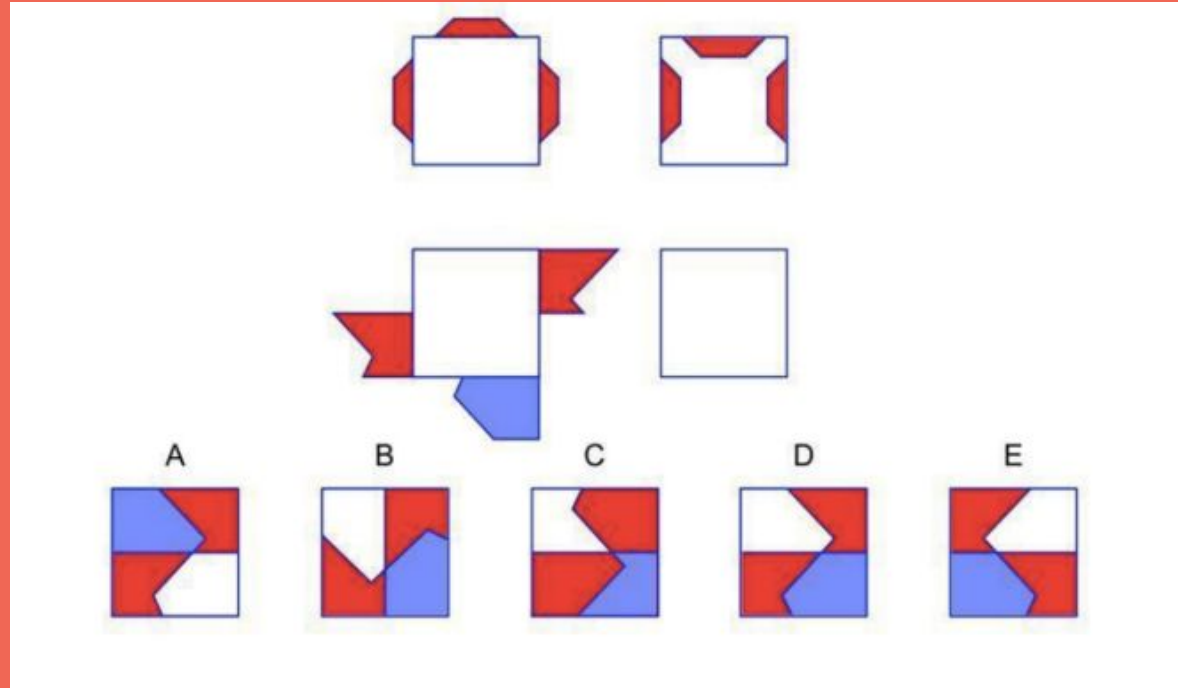




MUESTRA DE ARTÍCULO DE LA PRUEBA NNAT3

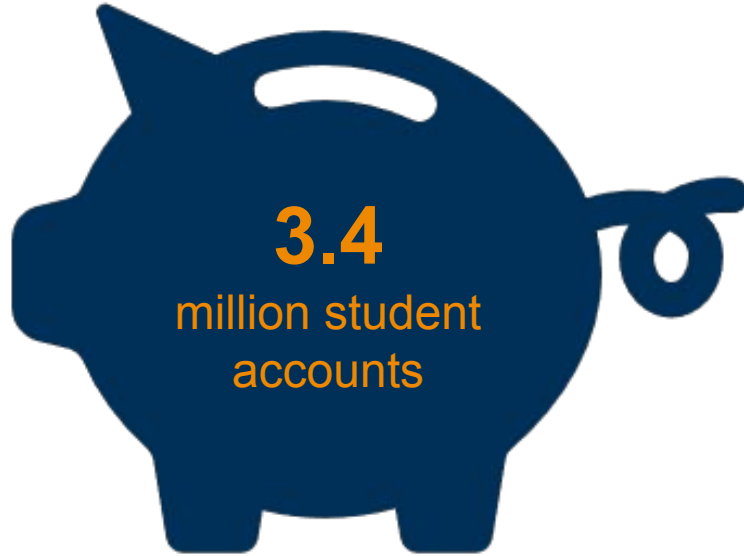

Who is Eligible for CalKIDS?

CalKIDS accounts are awarded to two groups:

- Newborns
- Low-Income Students



Eligibility – Newborns

- Each child born in California **on or after July 1, 2022, regardless of income status** is eligible
- Birth information is provided by the California Department of Public Health
- Please allow up to 90 days after birth registration for newborn to be included in program

Eligibility—Low-Income Students



- Low-income public-school students identified by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) on Fall Academic Census Day are eligible
- LCFF eligibility generally includes:
 - ☐ Student receives meals through the National School Lunch Program
 - ☐ Family submitted an Alternative Household Income Form
 - ☐ Student participates in CalFresh, CalWORKs, FDPIR (Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations), or Medi-Cal
 - ☐ English learner status
 - ☐ Migratory, homeless, and foster students
- Student information provided by the California Department of Education

Eligibility - Determination Timeline for Students

Year 1



- Academic Year 2021 – 2022
- Eligible 1st – 12th grade students
- Fall Academic Census Day for the 2021-2022 school year

Year 2 and Beyond






- Academic Year 2022 – 2023 and subsequent years
- Eligible 1st graders*
- Fall Academic Census Day of 1st grade school year

* Allow until spring/summer for 1st graders to be enrolled in program

The First Steps Toward College

The State of California is proud to announce the launch of the California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS). CalKIDS gives children in California a jump start on saving for college or career training. To be eligible for CalKIDS, participants must be:

1. Born in California on or after July 1, 2022; or
2. An eligible low-income public school student in grades 1-12* in California.

All participants receive a seed deposit in a CalKIDS account to help pay for future education after high school.

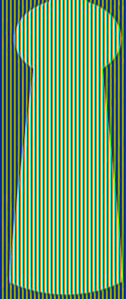

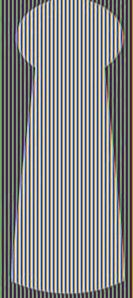


CalKIDS Awards – Low-Income Students



The State of California awards eligible low-income student CalKIDS participants the following deposits in a CalKIDS account, as applicable:

- **\$500** automatic deposit for each eligible low-income student
- **\$500** additional deposit for each eligible low-income student identified as a foster youth
- **\$500** additional deposit for each eligible low-income student identified as homeless

To help you get started on saving for college, the State of California is providing your child \$500 in a California Kids Investment and Development Savings Program (CalKIDS) account. Over time, these funds can grow tax deferred and are tax free when used for future qualified higher education expenses such as tuition, books, computers, and room and board.

The ScholarShare Investment Board—an agency of the State of California that oversees ScholarShare 529, California's official college savings plan—launched CalKIDS to help families start saving early for college and other forms of career training.

CalKIDS offers parents and eligible low-income public school students initial funds to help build college savings, including:

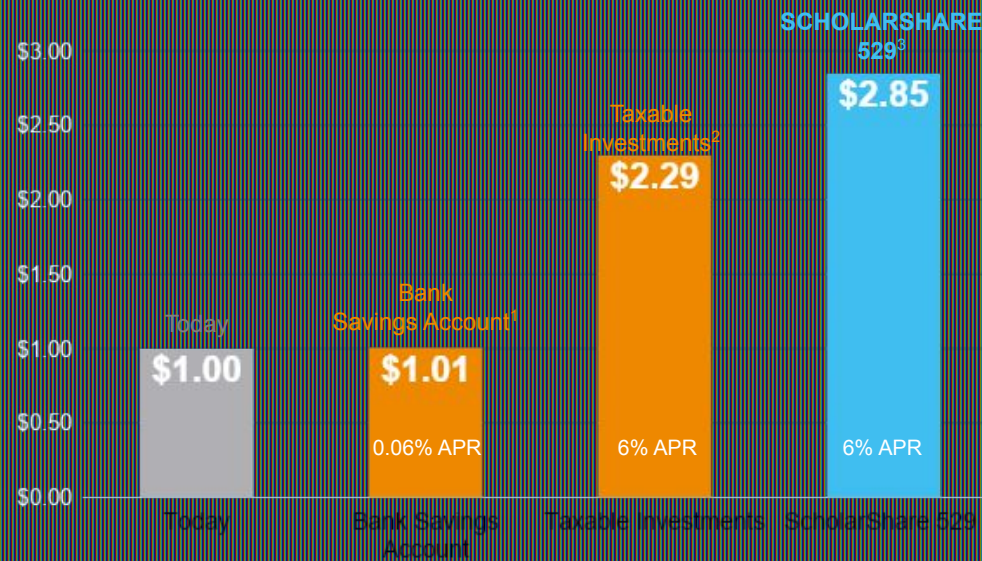
