She and her staff put out a great product each day and are willing, and sometimes even eager, to try something new. In December prior to the free meals, Mrs. Veazey collaborated with Mrs. Hill and the CNP staff at GSHS and began offering breakfast to the students. After a couple of days, Ms. Cindy recognized all students did realize the breakfasts were free, so she loaded up two rolling carts, made a "free breakfast" sign, and began weaving her way through students who were waiting before school. 






Parents of current 5th Graders - this information is for you and your student to learn about the opportunities awaiting them at GSMS!

Mrs. Fralick's class at GSES studied Mardi Gras this week and ended the lesson by making king cakes with the help of our sweet cafeteria staff!

















During the three-day Congress, Alexandria Baumann will join students from across the country and hear Nobel Laureates and National Medal of Science recipients discuss leading medical research; be given advice from Ivy League and top medical school deans on what to expect in medical school; witness stories told by patients who are living medical miracles; be inspired by fellow teen medical science prodigies; and learn about cutting-edge advances and the future in medicine and medical technology.

This is a crucial time in America when we need more doctors and medical scientists who are even better prepared for a future that is changing exponentially. Focused, bright and determined students like Alexandria Baumann are our future and she deserves all the mentoring and guidance we can give her.

The Academy offers free services and programs to students who want to become physicians or go into medical science. Some of the services and programs the Academy offers are online social networks through which future doctors and medical scientists can communicate; opportunities for students to be guided and mentored by physicians and medical students; and communications for parents and students on college acceptance and finances, skills acquisition, internships, career guidance and much more.

The National Academy of Future Physicians and Medical Scientists was founded on the belief that we must identify prospective medical talent at the earliest possible age and help these students acquire the necessary experience and skills to take them to the doorstep of this vital career.
