On 9 May, the Air Force Junior ROTC program of Bell High School conducted their annual Award's Night. During the ceremony, Cadet Captain Ean Rutherford was awarded the "American Legion General Military Excellence Award" and the "AF-JROTC Silver Valor Award." The AFJROTC Silver Valor Award, is JROTC's second highest national award and is issued to cadets, who save a person's life. The Air Force citation accompanying Ean's award reads: 'Cadet (c/) Captain Ean

Z. Rutherford distinguished himself by conspicuous heroic action above and beyond the call of duty by providing life saving measures for a child in Pineville, Kentucky on 26 February 2017.

c/Captain Rutherford, a junior volunteer fire fighter, was summoned to an ATV accident. As the first on scene, he encountered a frantic uncle with a seven year old niece who was severely injured and had stopped breathing. c/Captain Rutherford realized the girl was

aspirating in her own blood and immediately sprang into action. While utilizing his emergency medical training to treat her injuries and stabilize her condition, c/Captain Rutherford simultaneously provided critical information to the 911 dispatch while the Emergency Medical Technicians were en route to the scene

Upon completing his first responder duty of providing initial life sustaining care, he assisted the Emergency Medical Technicians with loading the patient into the ambulance, turned over care of the patient to the Emergency Medical Technicians and began to assume an accident scene assessment role. Quickly thereafter, the Emergency Medical Technicians realized that both of them would be required to continue patient treatment and stabilization during transport to the hospital. Once again, Cadet Captain Rutherford rose to the occasion, volunteering to drive the ambulance to the hospital as the Emergency Medical Technicians prepared for an aerial

The number of nominees each district may submit to the statewide process is based on the district-wide junior class enrollment. Over 2,000 applications are received at the state level each year, with approximately 1,000 students selected to attend.






