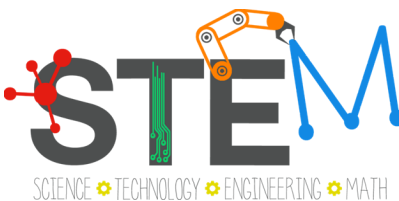

Take-Home STEM Kits for the Summer

The AIG department received a grant from the Community Foundation of the Dan River Region's Keokee Fund, a fund for academically gifted students. The grant will provide a take-home summer Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) kit for every 3rd-7th grade AIG student and for others who participated in Science Olympiad.

Each kit contains the materials needed to complete three different STEM activities linked to the upcoming year's curriculum. By participating in hands-on activities, students will obtain background knowledge for the following school year.

STEM kits will be distributed to the students before the end of the school year. Students will be asked to complete a survey about their experiences.

2022-2025 AIG Plan Approved by the Board of Education

Every three years, the Department of Public Instruction requires that a new local AIG plan be written. This year sub-committees comprised of parents/guardians, teachers, instructional coaches, principals, and the AIG director and coordinator worked to review and rewrite Caswell County's plan. The Board of Education approved the plan at their May 9th meeting.

What is in the plan?

The plan consists of 6 standards that cover topics such as AIG identification and services, partnerships, personnel, and professional development. Practices within each standard describe how Caswell County Schools meets each required component.
