Registration Guidelines

Students and parents/guardians should select classes wisely and carefully during the registration process as staffing and resources are impacted by these selections. Listed below are some criteria you should use to make these choices.

1. Review high school graduation requirements.
2. Review College entrance requirements.
3. If you are an athlete, you will also need to review your selections with regard to the NCAA Clearinghouse guidelines.
4. Check all course offerings and carefully read the descriptions of those classes you are interested in taking.
5. All students are required to sign up for a total of 6.0 credits.
6. Music, Journalism, Yearbook, SOAR, and Student Government are by application only.
7. **Do not sign up for classes you do not intend to take next year.** Schedule changes are very difficult to obtain because the Master Schedule is built on student requests.
8. Students testing below grade level in reading will automatically be placed in a supplemental reading class.
9. AP classes are rigorous advance placement college level courses, which will require a mandatory College Board test in May with a fee attached. (Must complete required AP Form with parent and teacher's signatures).
