Registration Guidelines

- 4. Check all course offerings and carefully read the descriptions of those classes you are interested in taking.
- 5. All students are required to sign up for a total of 6.0 credits.
- 6. Music, Journalism, Yearbook, SOAR, and Student Government are by application only.
- 7. <u>Do not sign up for classes you do not intend to take next year.</u> Schedule changes are very difficult to obtain because the Master Schedule is built on student requests.
- 8. Students testing below grade level in reading will automatically be placed in a supplemental reading class.
- 9. AP classes are rigorous advance placement college level courses, which will require a mandatory College Board test in May with a fee attached. (Must complete required AP Form with parent and teacher's signatures).
