JH Student Handbook Revisions for 2016-17 Based on Policy

Administration shared that the District already uses restorative justice and progressive discipline required by SB 100. District administration looks at students individually when considering discipline consequences per handbook.

Review of IASB Proposed Changes

- a. 6:130 Program for the Gifted – Present to Board as presented by IASB.
- b. 7:150 Agency and Police Interviews – Present to Board as presented by IASB along with 7:150 AP.
- c. 7:190 Student Behavior – Present to Board with Option 2 & 3 (replace “may” with “shall”); keep title “Student Discipline”; and change “society” to “club” under #16. The committee discussed levels of consequences for various infractions. The administration should have flexibility to use their discretion.
- d. 7:200 Suspension Procedures – Present to Board as presented by IASB.
- e. 7:210 Expulsion Procedures – Present to Board as presented by IASB.
- f. 7:220 Bus Conduct – Present to Board with change of “Student Behavior” to “Student Discipline” under #1.
- g. 7:240 Conduct Code for Participants in Extracurricular Activities – Present to Board as presented by IASB.
- h. 7:305 Student Athlete Concussions and Head Injuries – Present to Board as presented by IASB. The committee suggested it would be a good idea for all students to review the IHSA concussion video. Records of students who have seen the video are kept in the school office.

School Service Award


Policy Committee recommends the School Service Award not be awarded until the Board of Education has decided upon criteria for the award in the future.
