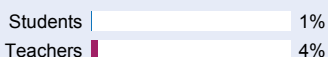

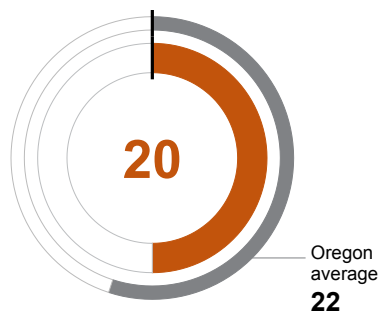

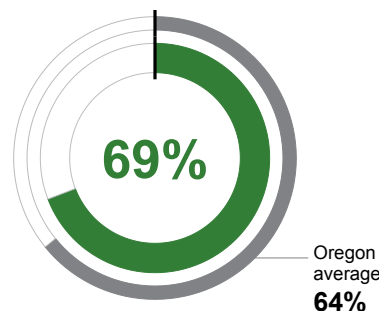

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

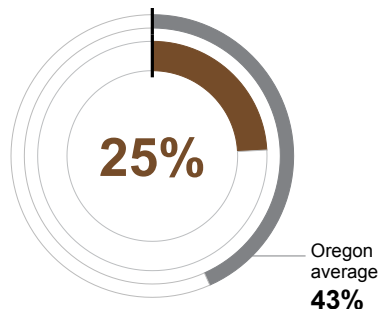
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

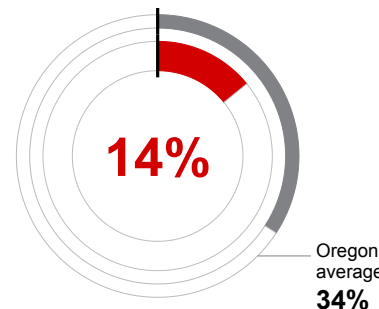
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



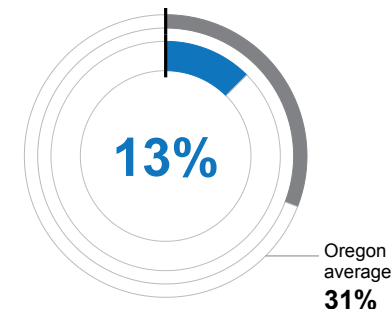
MATHEMATICS

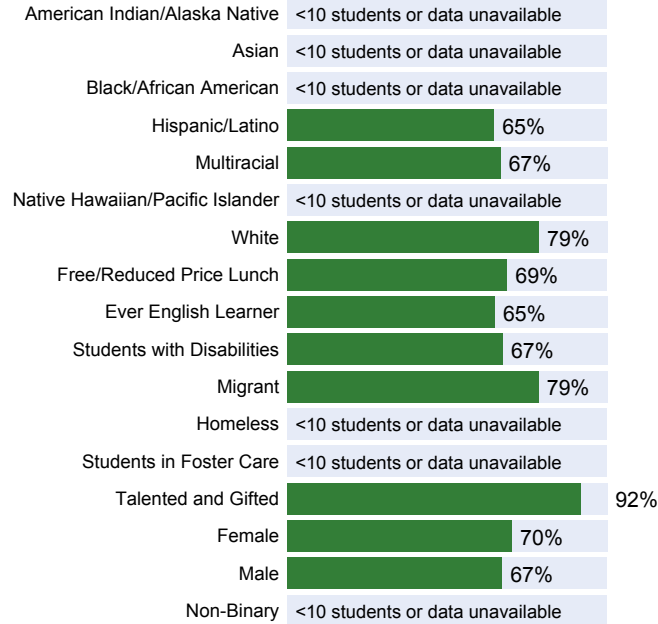

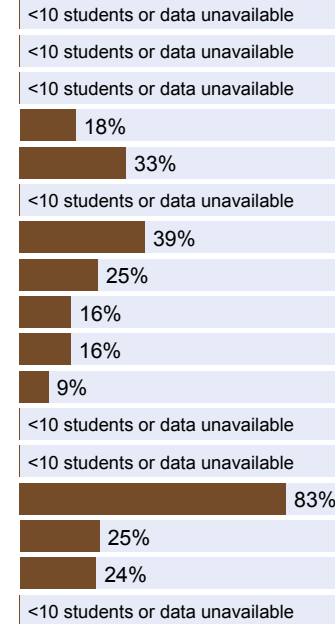

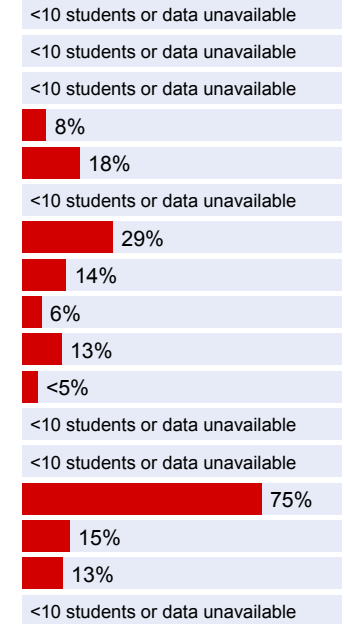

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Mooberry is fortunate to have families who are incredibly supportive of the systems we use to help our students learn and grow. Families are welcome to join our Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) or our Parent Teacher Organization, known as the Mooberry Community Corral (MCC). We also have a Family Outreach liaison who makes connections with families and provides direct resource assistance and/or outside referrals. We are always available to listen to the ideas, questions, and concerns of our families, as we are here to serve and partner with you.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We appreciate the longstanding relationships we have built with our community partners and the support they provide for our students and families. Start Making A Reader Today (SMART) provides opportunities for volunteers to read to younger students, and for those same students to receive free books they can read at home. Additionally, the Hillsboro Nazarene Church has for several years provided assistance to families in need, including many of the donations that stock our food pantry. The Young Artists Club has also provided a number of fun and engaging opportunities for students and families to enjoy as well as resources to use at home, and has participated in events aimed at bringing the community together.
