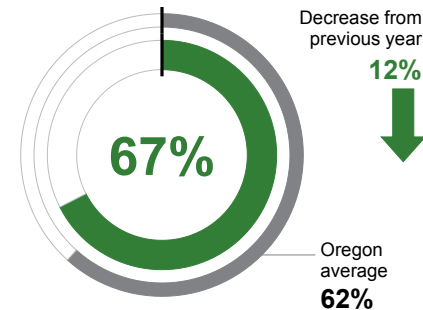
### CLASS SIZE

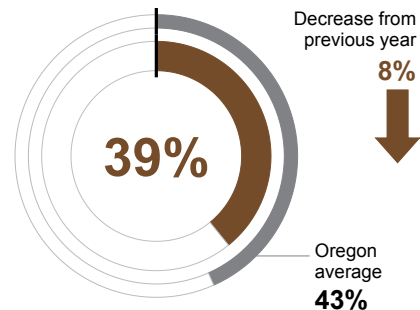

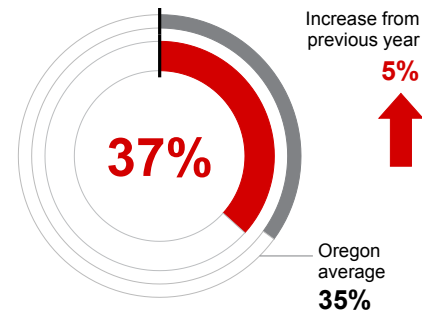
#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



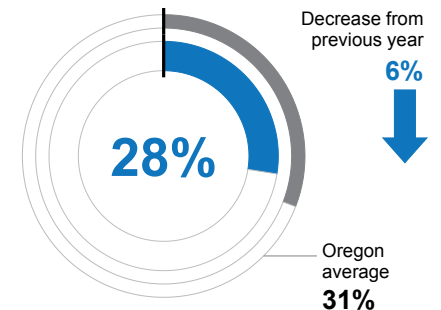
#### MATHEMATICS

### School Goals

At Tobias, we believe that all students can grow academically and socially. We are focused on strengthening our core instruction in language arts, math, and academic language development. We also use differentiated, small group instruction to meet students' needs. Tobias is focused on enhancing social-emotional growth during morning meetings, through social-emotional lessons, and by building connections within the school community. In doing so, we will ensure all students have consistent access and support needed to build and extend their academic and social skills.

### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

We recognize the worth of all students and are committed to providing a safe and inclusive space for everyone, regardless of their race, color, religion, immigration status, or any other basis. Students learn best when they feel safe and valued. Classes hold daily morning meetings where staff and students create strong relationships and practice positive social interactions. 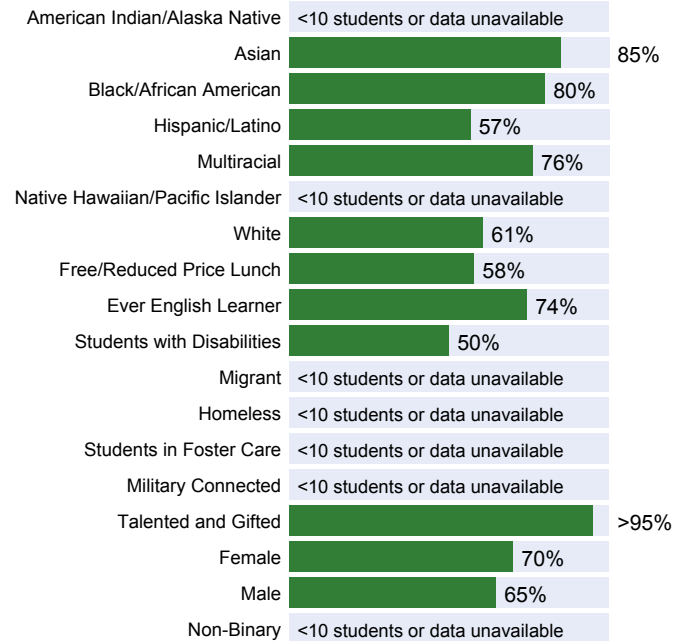

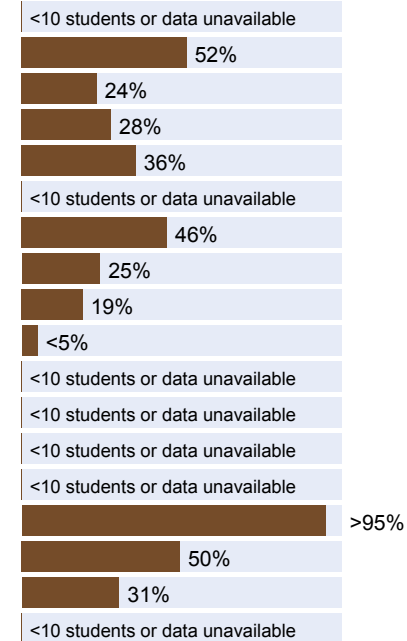

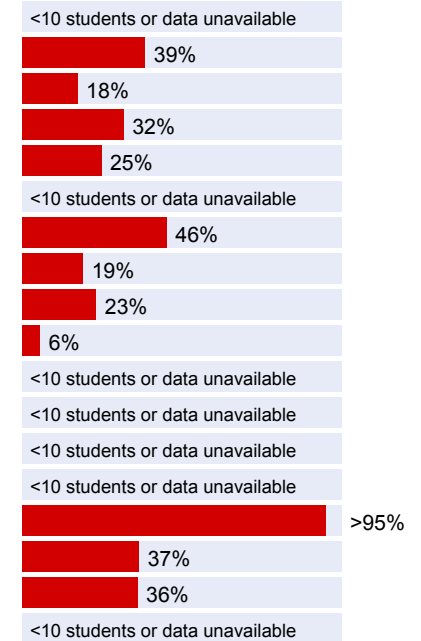

Additionally, we strive to engage all of our caregivers by providing interpretation support for those who speak multiple languages. #### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We are fortunate to be part of a community that actively supports student learning.
