### **ENROLLMENT**



To enroll, complete and return a Help Me Home registration form along with a passport-like photo, and a \$20 check made payable to the Washington County Sheriff's Office. Program registration will be in effect for two years, but information must be updated as needed to stay current.

# WHEN TO CALL 9-1-1

#### **CALL 9-1-1 IF THE PERSON IS MISSING**

If the registered person is missing, it is never too soon to call 9-1-1, especially if they are a person with disabilities or endangered/at-risk.

Inform the 9-1-1 dispatch operator and responding law enforcement that the missing person is registered in the Help Me Home program. This will further expedite access to critical information and the photo.

### HELP ME HOME PROGRAM

The Help Me Home program was developed internally by the Washington County Sheriff's Office as a voluntary enrollment program for those at-risk or endangered county residents who are found but have difficulty communicating vital information such as their name, phone number or address.

Those who are registered with Help Me Home have their photo and pertinent identification information placed in a database that deputies and law enforcement personnel can access via their laptops in their patrol vehicles. **Registrant information is kept confidential**.

# ASSISTANCE WITH LOCATING A LOVED ONE

When a deputy or police officer finds a disoriented and/or non-verbal individual alone in the community, they can quickly query the database using personal identifiers.

While managed by the Washington County Sheriff's Office, this system is accessible to all law enforcement agencies throughout the county.

### **ENROLLMENT AGE**

Program enrollment is open to all ages.





With a match in the Help Me Home database, **caregivers will be contacted immediately** to let them know their loved one has been located.
